To consider the report of the Vice Chancellor, regarding the developments since the last Court Meeting, held on 11th April, 2014.

It is a matter of great satisfaction that the Administrative Section of the University has been shifted to the Campus at Bagla (Rahya-Suchani), District Samba, Jammu – 181143, in January, 2015.All the administrative activities are now executed from this very campus.

During the period under report, the emphasis remained on strengthening the existing Post-Graduate Programmes, introduction of four new Research Degree Programmes, fulfillment of admission processes and recruitment of faculty and non-teaching staff. Diverse initiatives were also undertaken during this period while the main focus remained on Campus development at the allotted site.

1.1 Appointment of the Vice Chancellor

Professor Ashok Aima took over as the Vice Chancellor of the Central University of Jammu, Jammu (J&K) w.e.f. 17th April, 2015 (F/N), in pursuance of MHRD letter No. 52-4/2014-CU.III, dated 17th April, 2015.

1.2 Admissions

Admission process through CUCET-2014 started with issuance of admission notice by the Nodal University (Central University of Rajasthan) on 10th March, 2014 and the last date for filling of application forms, online, by the candidates was 10th April, 2014. The Central University of Jammu had advertised admission notice for eight Integrated M.Phil.-Ph.D Programmes besides twelve Post-Graduate Programmes, including four new Masters Degree Programmes, viz., Public Policy & Public Administration, National Security Studies, Mass



Communication and New Media, and Social Work, as approved by the Competent Authorities for the Academic Session 2014-15. Intake of 30 students per Programme was fixed for admission to all the disciplines of Master's Degree Programme and five seats for each Integrated M.Phil-Ph.D. Programme, except Mathematics in which case three seats were prescribed as intake capacity. Entrance test for admission to Under-Graduate Integrated Programme was held on 26th and 27th April, 2014. Although Central University of Jammu is not offering Under-Graduate Integrated Programmes, yet students were accorded this facility for appearing for collegiums' partner Central Universities offering these courses. Entrance test for the Post-Graduate Degree and Research Degree Programmes was held on 17th and 18th May, 2014. The result of CUCET-2014 was declared on 13th June, 2014.

1.8 CUCET 2015

Preparations regarding conduct of Entrance Test to be held on 6th and 7th June, 2015 for the Academic Session 2015-16 have been undertaken. The Vice Chancellors and senior officials of the Participating Universities attended a meeting on 9th March, 2015 at Association of Indian Universities House, New Delhi, where the performance of CUCET – 2014 was reviewed. Further, the Central University of Rajasthan was again approved as Nodal University for the conduct of CUCET-2015, to execute admission of students in the participating Universities at all-India level.

Admission notice by the Nodal University was issued on 6th April, 2015 and the last date for filling application forms, online, by the candidates was on 5th May, 2015. The Central University of Jammu has advertised admission notice for eight



Integrated M.Phil-Ph.D. Programmes and twelve Post-Graduate Programmes for the Academic Session 2015-16. Intake of 30 students for each Programme has been prescribed for admission to all the disciplines of Master's Degree Programmes and five seats for each Integrated M.Phil-Ph.D. Programme, except Mathematics and Education in which three seats each have been prescribed as intake capacity. The Entrance Examination is scheduled to take place on 6th& 7th June, 2015.

The response to the admission notice was enormous this time due to strenuous efforts made by the University by involving print and electronic media in multiple ways. The number of candidates desirous of seeking admission rose nearly three times. In 2014-15, 2666 applications were received by the University. In 2015-16, 8775 applications have already been received. It was encouraging initiative which may enable the University to select the best & most meritorious students.

1.9 Examinations and Results

The Examinations for Semester II and Semester IV pertaining to the Academic Session 2013-14 were held in May-June, 2014, the results of which were declared in July-August, 2014. The average pass percentage in Semester II and Semester IV came to be 92.2% and 98.7%, respectively.

The Examinations for Semester I and Semester III, pertaining to the Academic Session 2014-15, were held in December, 2014, the results of which were declared in March-April, 2015. The average pass percentages in Semester I and Semester III came to be 76.9% and 91%, respectively.

The OPAC (Online Public Access Catalog) facilitates in searching of books by Accession number, title, author and keyword.

The Central Library is going to become the member of (Developing Library Network) DELNET, New Delhi. The membership will help the faculty, research scholars and students to locate the books through the union catalogue of books created by DELNET. The DELNET has developed the network of libraries of India which helps in smooth inter-library loan activities.

The University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, has sanctioned Swami Vivekananda Chair to the Central University of Jammu in the Department of Public Policy and Public Administration. The Chair has been sanctioned in the area of "Governance and Ethics". The Chair comprises a post of Professor, Other secretarial assistance and contingent grant. A sum of Rs. 25 lakh has been sanctioned initially. The performance of Chair shall be reviewed after establishment of five years.

1.39 Establishment of Community College

The University has submitted a proposal to UGC for establishment of Community College under the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) for promotion of Vocational Education. Under this scheme, the University proposes to launch Diploma programmes in Banking & Insurance, Beauty and Wellness and Office Automation and E-Governance, during first Phase-I. In the Phase-II, the University intends to run Diploma programmes in Embroidery, Dress Designing & Tailoring, and Computer Hardware and Networking. In the Phase III, the university proposes to start Diploma in Stock Market & Trading Operations, Electrician and Diploma in Mobile Computing.

The proposed programmes shall have multiple exit options for students, as has been recommended in the guidelines. This will provide the students with an option to walk out from the programme for Certificate, Advanced Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma programmes after accumulating required credits as envisaged in the scheme. The proposed programme is unique in the sense that 40% of the course is having general educational and rest 60% is skill based component. For skill based component, industry partners have been indentified and University has obtained LOI's from the industry partners like VLCC for Beauty and Wellness Course, HDFC Bank for Banking and Financial Services and Global Business Solutions, Mind Bridge Asia for soft skill training.

1.40 Support from UGC

The University received Rs. 240.00 crore during the 12th Five Year Plan against the approved allocation of Rs. 388.50 crore. The year wise breakup is as follows:-

A. Status of Land and infrastructural Development of the University

The Central University of Jammu has now been in possession of entire land measuring 4880 Kanals 19 Marlas, which stands handed over by the State Govt. The University was handed over the land in installments and the last patch of land



was taken over on 31st July, 2014. The breakup of the said allotted land is as under:

It is a matter of satisfaction that all the formalities associated with the transfer of land stand completed, local disputes notwithstanding, which are also being handled by the State Govt.

B. Infrastructure Development Initiatives at the Campus Site, Village Bagla, Samba.

The University identified and decided to take up the construction of such buildings, which could be completed by ending June, 2014, naming it as Sub-Phase-I of Phase-I, of the Campus development. The buildings identified to be taken up for construction as first priority are the Directorate of Distance Education, approximately 60 quarters of Professors/Associate Professors/Assistant Professors, along with associated services and approach roads, in order to make these buildings functional and habitable. With completion of the said two types of buildings, the University intends to commence the additional academic activities of five new Departments in the campus, during the next Academic Session. The same would also cater to the immediate need of a hostel for the students, by modifying the Professors' quarters, besides providing residential facility during 2015-16 session. Though pace of construction has not matched the University requirement and planning, yet efforts are being scheduled to get the immediately required buildings completed before the revised time schedule of October, 2015.



The Executive Council, on recommendations of the Finance Committee, has approved the budget estimates of the phase-I and sub-phase-I of the development of the University Campus, in its meeting held on 29th June, 2013 for an amount of Rs. 1187.91 Crores and Rs. 116.29 Crores, respectively. Accordingly, EPIL (approved PMC) was conveyed the approval to initiate the tendering process. M/s EPIL has floated the tender for the work of sub-phase-I and part of Phase-I to the lowest bidders. M/s Nagarjun Construction Corporation Ltd (NCCL) was adjudged as the lowest bidder for sub-phase-I. The University, after seeking justification from the PMC, approved the contract.

The work is in progress and every effort is being made to complete the sub-phase-I within the revised timeline. The University has identified and prioritized the construction of such buildings and infrastructure out of the phase-I in order to make the Campus functional within a short span of time, commensurate with the availability of funds. Tender for the Road Network and Utilities, vital for shifting of teaching faculties to the main campus, has also been approved for allotment at a cost of Rs. 264.98 Cr. in favour of a reputed construction agency, namely M/s SEW Infra Ltd. Hyderabad. The works for the Internal & External Electrification of the campus and University Guest House have also been finalized and allotted to M/s Anil Kumar & Co. Ghazibad at a cost of Rs. 43.99 Crores and M/s Percept Builders, Jammu, at a Cost of Rs. 4.76 Crores respectively.

Apart from providing land free of cost, State Govt. is required to provide basic infrastructural needs of Access Road, Water Supply, and Power Supply up to the periphery of the University. These vital issues have not been given requisite attention, so far, and without these no sustained development can be visualized. Though, the State Government is alive to the commitment as mentioned above, yet the proposals are still in infancy. University exercises a regular follow-up, with

the State Govt. through Chief Secretary, Planning Commissioner and concerned administrative heads, yet the same has also not met with any success so far. The issue has also been brought to the notice of Dr. Jitendra Singh, Union Minister, MOS (Independent Charge), Development of North Eastern Region,PMO (Personnel) and Dr. Nirmal Singh, Dy.CM, J&K State Govt. and Shri Chander Prakash Ganga, local MLA and Minister for Industries and Commerce, for their kind intervention with regard to the fast-tracking of the said infrastructure, to ensure the availability of basic amenities. It is an urgent requirement as some of the teaching departments are being shifted to main Campus and the students/faculty have to be provided with the basic facilities.



Confirmation of the Minutes of the 2nd Meeting of the Court, held on 11th April, 2014.

Minutes of the Second Meeting of the Court held on 11th April, 2014, were circulated vide letter No. CUJ/Adm/Court/2014/1255-1283 dated 9th June, 2014. One of the worthy members made observations with regard to Item No. 3.8 at Page No. 11 of the Minutes. With the approval of the Hon'ble Chancellor, in his capacity as Chairperson of the Court, the relevant part under Item No. 3.8, Page No. 11 of the said Minutes, was substituted as under:

"Shri B.S. Baswan emphasized the need for a proper skill development initiative, which may include courses on hospitality, computer, plumbing, electricity, floriculture, and such other courses, so that the youth is able to acquire Skill Based Education and earn their livelihood and also contribute to the society, apart from keeping traditional skills alive."

The rest of the part remains unchanged.

The aforesaid modification in the Minutes, was circulated to the members of the Court vide letter no. CUJ/Adm/Court/2014/3879-3908 dated 13.08.2014.

The Court may consider confirmation of the minutes, accordingly.

To consider Annual Report for the year, 2013-14.

Section 30(1) of the Central Universities Act, 2009, provides that the Annual Report of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Executive Council, which shall include, among other matters, the steps taken by the University towards the fulfillment of its objectives and shall be submitted to the Court on or before, such date as may be prescribed by the Statute and the Court shall consider the report in its Annual Meeting. According to Section 30(2), the Court shall submit the Annual Report to the Visitor, along with its comments, if any.

Further, as per Section 30(3) of the Act, the Annual Report shall also be submitted to the Central Government, which shall, as soon as may be, cause the same to be laid before both the Houses of Parliament. The Annual Report as prepared was placed before the Executive Council of the University in its meetings held on 21st December, 2014. Copies of the Annual Report, as approved by the Executive Council, have already been submitted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, within the prescribed time, for laying before both Houses of Parliament.

Section 20(2)(b) of the Central Universities Act, 2009, *inter alia*, provides for the Court to consider and pass a resolution on the Annual Report of the University.

The Annual Report for the period from 1st April, 2013 to 31st March, 2014 is placed before the Court for consideration as **Annexure-I** (**Separate Set**).

To consider Annual Accounts, along with Audit Report, for the Financial Year 2013-14.

Section 31(1) and (2) of the Central Universities Act, 2009 provides that the Annual Accounts and Balance Sheet of the University shall be prepared under the directions of the Executive Council and shall be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India, at least once every year, and at intervals of not more than fifteen months.

A copy of the Annual Accounts, together with the Audit Report, thereon, shall be submitted to the Court and the Visitor, along with the observations of the Executive Council.

Accordingly, the Annual Accounts of the University for the period 1st April, 2013 to 31st March, 2014 were compiled in accordance with principles and procedures laid down by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of India, and as per the guidelines of the UGC. The Accounts were prepared on accrued basis. The compiled Annual Accounts were considered and approved by the Finance Committee and the Executive Council, in their meetings held on 26th April, 2014 and 3rd May, 2014, respectively, before submission to CAG for auditing.

The CAG Audit party completed the auditing of the Accounts on 17th June, 2014 and the Principal Director (Audit), Chandigarh, on behalf of CAG issued the Separate Audit Report (SAR) for the year 2013-14, vide letter No. PDA(C) CE/SAR's/2014-15/313 dated 9th October, 2014.

The Annual Accounts, along with SAR for the year 2013-14, as recommended by the Finance Committee in its meeting held on 5th November, 2014, were approved by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 21stNovember, 2014.

Copies of the Annual Accounts, along with SAR, as approved by the Executive Council, has been submitted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, for laying before both Houses of Parliament in terms of Section 31(4) of the Act.

Section 20(2)(b) of the Act, *inter-alia*, provides for the Court to consider and pass resolution on the Annual Accounts of the University and the Audit Report on such accounts.

The Annual Accounts, along with Separate Audit Report for the year 2013-14, is placed before the Court for consideration, as **Annexure-II** (Separate Set).

To consider the Revised Estimates for the Financial Year 2014-15, and, the Budget Estimates for the Financial Year, 2015-16.

The Central Universities Act, 2009, Statute 10(2) provides that at an annual meeting of the Court, a report of the working of the University during the previous year, together with a statement of receipt and expenditure, the balance sheet as audited and the financial estimates for the next year shall be presented.

The estimates were based on actual flow of funds for expenditure under revenue and capital items. During the year 2013-14, the University had eight P.G. programmes and four integrated M.Phil- Ph.D. programmes. During the Financial year 2014-15, the University started four more integrated M.Phil-Ph.D. programmes and two part-time Ph.D. programmes. The increase in capital and revenue expenditure is attributed to academic and construction activities at the Campus site.

The University had unspent balance of Rs. 1300.71 lakh as on 1st April, 2014 which was taken as the opening balance for the financial year 2014-15. An amount of Rs. 800.45 lakh was income against the anticipated receipt of Rs.107.50 lakh during the year 2014-15. The demand projected for the year 2014-15 was estimated to the extent of Rs. 25702.30 lakh against which the Revised Estimates for the year 2014-15 was Rs.18053.52 lakh. An amount of Rs. 15962.50 lakh has been received from UGC under General Development Scheme against the anticipated receipt of Rs. 17500.00 lakh. The Budget Estimates for the financial year 2015-16 are Rs. 28418.95 lakh. The funds amounting to Rs. 28005.00 lakh are required as G.I.A. from UGC after taking into account an estimated income of Rs. 311.10 lakh and Rs. 1052.06 lakh as opening Balance for the year 2015-16. Thus, leaving a closing balance of Rs.949.21 lakh to meet out the requirements of the first quarter of the next financial year. The Budget

Estimates have been prepared keeping in view the construction activities already initiated and scheduled to be started in upcoming financial year at Campus site and other recurring expenses including Salaries, Non-NET Fellowships etc.

The Revised Estimates for the year 2014-15 and the Budget Estimates for the year 2015-16 were discussed in the meeting of the Finance Committee held on 05th November, 2014. The Finance Committee resolved to approve the item and recommended the same for consideration of the Executive Council.

The Executive Council in its meeting held on 21st November, 2014 approved the recommendations of the Finance Committee.

The Revised Estimates for the year 2014-15 and the Budget Estimates for the year 2015-16 are placed before the Court for consideration as **Annexure-III** (Page No. 47 – 50).

Fixing the date for the next meeting of the Court, with the permission of the Chair.

The Central Universities Act, 2009, Statute 10(1) provides that an Annual meeting of the Court shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Executive Council, unless some other date has been fixed by the Court in respect of any year.



The University has made 46 appointments at the level of Assistant Professors, out of which 24 are Ph.D. Degree holder.

Associate Professors appointed through regular selection/deputation hold Ph.D. Degree. The faculty which have been appointed on the basis of NET/SLET/SET have been asked to complete their Ph.D. Course from this University or from elsewhere at the earliest.

The matter is however submitted for consideration of the Court.



To plan introduction of flexible Credit Based System in all courses.

The Central University of Jammu has already introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all Courses which is in vogue. The UGC has sent the revised guidelines regarding CBCS vide letter no. F. 1-1/2014(Secv) dated 12.11.2014 for adopting the same by the Universities in all Courses from the Academic Session 2015-16.

The University has discussed these guidelines in a meeting with the Heads of the Departments and resolved to introduce the guidelines of UGC from the Academic Session 2015-16. Two workshops have been held in this regard by UGC – one was at Central University of Rajasthan and the other was at Central University of Kashmir. The Vice Chancellor and the Academic Coordinator attended the meeting and presented plan of action to be followed in the Central University of Jammu. An MoU has been signed among Central University of Jammu, Central University of Kashmir and Central University of Himachal Pradesh to build minimum Common Courses among different programmes to facilitate seamless mobility and transfer of Credits. It is a learner centric flexible approach and the scheme to be introduced in two years programme is detailed as under:-

1. Core Courses		48 Credits
2. Discipline Specific Elective	:	16 Credits

3. Interdisciplinary Specific Elective : 08 Credits

4. Foundations

a) Compulsory 04 Credits 04 Credits b) Elective (Skill Based)

In three year Course, 50% more Credits Courses shall be added, making it a total of 120 Credits.

The University in this year made all possible efforts for giving wider publicity for 2015-16 academic session through newspapers, Cable TV, SMS, public hoarding, posters, banners. Presentations were also made by the faculty in various degree colleges. As a result, number of applicants who opted for Central University of Jammu shot upto 8775 against 2666 in 2014-15, out of whom 6100 (approx.) appeared for Entrance Examination at Jammu centre besides students appearing in 39 centres across country opting for Central University of Jammu.



To introduce appropriate applied science and skill training courses.

The Central University of Jammu proposes to introduce eight (8) new courses from Academic Session 2016-17 in following streams as under:-

- 1. M.Tech. in Space Technology
- 2. M.Sc. in Nano Technology
- 3. M.Tech. in Earth Sciences
- 4. M.Tech. in Nuclear Physics
- 5. M.Tech. in Computational Mathematics
- 6. M.Sc. in Bioinformatics
- 7. MBA Marketing and Supply Chain Management
- 8. 5 years Integrated Law

As part of Skill Training Courses, Community College has been approved by the UGC in June 2015 under National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF). Under Community College **Beauty and Wellness Programme** is approved which the University intends to start from the current Academic Session 2015-16 and for which Industry Skill Knowledge Partners have been identified, which includes VLCC, Global Business Solutions, Mind Bridge Asia.

In addition to this, University has advertised for admissions in B.Voc Courses in **Retail Management** and **Tourism Management** with multiple exit points approved by UGC in June, 2014 and for which the response is encouraging.

The University has also submitted a proposal under above scheme for introducing courses in Journalism and Environmental Management to UGC.



To set up a Research Integrity Committee in the University to investigate cases of academic and scientific misconduct by students and faculty.

The issue is of vital importance to check plagiarism and cases of academic and scientific misconduct by the students and faculty. The outcome of the decision on the issue shall be placed before the Academic Council and decision emanating from the Court shall be taken to a logical conclusion so that any kind of academic and scientific misconduct is dealt with by such a Committee.
