Introductory

- 2. At the outset, the Vice Chancellor graciously welcomed Sh. Gopalaswamy Parthasarathy, being appointed as the 2nd Chancellor of the University and expressed gratitude for attending the 5th University Court Meeting. The Vice Chancellor also welcomed and introduced Dr. Ashok Bhan, Prof. Pervez Mustajab, Eminent Director Sh. Balwant Thakur and Prof. Manoj Dhar, hon'ble members of the Court and special invitees. The Vice Chancellor read a felicitation letter sent by Air Marshal Kapil Kak, congratulating Sh. G. Parthasarathy, on his appointment as 2nd Chancellor of the Central University of Jammu.
- The Vice Characellor expressed gratitude to Sh. N.N. Vohra, Former Governor of Jammu & Kashmir State and 1st Chancellor of the Central University of Jammu for guiding and supporting the University in higher learning and research endeavours.
- 4. The Vice Chancellor pleased to inform the members that Sh. Gopalaswamy Parthasarathy, Former Ambassador, has taken over the

charge of 2nd Chancellor of the University, w.e.f. 4th July, 2018. He apprised the members that Sh. G. Parthasarathy is among the 04 Ambassadors who had visited the university earlier for lectures in Central University of Jammu in the Department of National Security Studies, Department of Public Policy and Public Administration; and other Departments under "Distinguished Lecture Series" funded by the Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India. The Vice Chancellor briefed the Chancellor and other members about the Motto, Vision and Mission of the University. He informed the Chancellor that earlier the University was located at two campuses, main campus at Rahya-Suchani (Bagla), District Samba, and other Temporary Academic Block (TAB), at Sainik Colony, Jammu. He further informed that all the Departments have been shifted to the main campus from this academic session.

- 5. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that the university has adopted paperless and cashless initiatives on the directions of the UGC/MHRD, therefore, hard copies of the Agenda & other documents related to the meeting have not been circulated to the members instead the soft copies of the same were sent through emails. The same procedure has been adopted in the previous meetings of 10th Academic Council and 14th Executive Council which were held on 24th August, 2018 and 31st August, 2018 respectively.
- 6. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that the Central University of Jammu has got B++ ranking with score of 2.88 by the National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, in the first cycle. He informed that the Central University of Jammu is holding the top position among the other 07 Central Universities who had undergone NAAC. The Vice Chancellor further informed that the university will undergo NAAC in the 2nd cycle in January, 2019.
- 7. The Vice Chancellor informed the members that 1st Convocation of the University has been successfully conducted on 18th March, 2018 at Zoravar Singh, Auditorium, University of Jammu. His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama was the Chief Guest on the occasion. Prof. Amitabh Mattoo was the Guest of Honour. Degrees of Honoris Causa were conferred upon Dr. Jitendra Singh, MoS PMO, and Gen. N.C. Vij, Former Chief of Army Staff. The students from 2011 to 2017 batches were awarded 14 Ph.D., 20 M.Phil. and 885 Post Graduate Degrees.
- 8. The Vice Chancellor presented the details of the meetings of the Executive Council, Academic Council, Court, Finance Committee, Planning

Board, Building Committee, School Boards and Board of Studies held during the last year. He informed that the meeting of the Planning Board has been fixed few days back but due to non-availability of members, the same could not be convened.

- The Vice Chancellor informed the members that 45 programmes under 9. Social Sciences, Humanities, Management, Sciences, Vocational, Basic & Applied Sciences; 02 Research Centres have been running. The Vice Chancellor further informed that 02 Research Chairs (Swami Vivekananda Chair, Deen Dayal Upadhyay Chair) have been sanctioned to the university and 01 chair has been sponsored by the J&K Bank. The Vice Chancellor was pleased to inform the members that UGC has sanctioned new courses under National Skill Qualification Framework i.e. 01 in Banking and Financial Services, 04 in Make-up, Tourism, Retail and Fashion Designing cum Tailoring under Community College specially customised for rural girls to make them self-dependent and skill oriented. He further informed that University has 100% placement record for Diploma in Beauty & Wellness program under Community College of the university. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that the university had submitted a proposal for starting vocational courses under Deen Dayal Upadhyay Kaushal Kendras Centre.
- 10. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members about the average pass percentage of 2nd, 4th and 6th Semesters of Post Graduate programs and 2nd & 4th Semesters of UG programs whose exams were held in May 2018.
- 11. The Vice Chancellor complimented the Examination wing, Dr. Gaurav Sehgal, I/c Controller of Examinations and Sh.Vikas Gupta, AR (Examinations & ICT), for their contribution in digitising the examination processes like online admit cards, mark sheets, date sheets, etc.
- 12. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that this year also Central University of Jammu has been a part of collegiums of 09 Central Universities for conduct of Central Universities Common Entrance Test (CUCET) 2018. The entrance test has been successfully conducted by the university on 6th & 7th May, 2018 at 09 centres at different locations i.e. Jammu (04 centres), Udhampur (02 centres), Kathua (01 centres), Rajouri (01 centre) and Bhadarwah (01 new centre). The Vice Chancellor informed the members that this year approximately 38,000 applications have been received from Pan India candidates. The admissions for PG and UG courses have been completed. The Vice Chancellor presented the details of students admitted in

each program and also informed that the university has got an overwhelming response in Under Graduate courses (Five year Integrated programs in Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology). The Vice Chancellor also apprised the members that more than 65% of female students from different states/regions have got admitted in the university.

- 13. The Vice Chancellor informed the members that university had advertised faculty positions in various programs but after the judgement passed by the Supreme Court, the UGC directed the Universities to cancel the advertisements till the fresh guidelines are received. He informed that about nine times rolling advertisements were floated for appointment of senior faculty but no response has been received. He also informed that the university has hired Adjunct Faculty to fill-up the gap of senior faculty. He apprised the members that university has been able to fill teaching positions upto the level of Associate Professors and Assistant Professors. The Vice Chancellor informed that other Central Universities are also facing the same problem.
- 14. The Vice Chancellor informed that the university had conducted written tests/skill tests of 21 Non-Teaching positions of Group A, B & C posts, and interviews for Group A posts only. The Executive Council of the university has approved the recommendations of the Selection Committee meetings constituted for the purpose in its 14th meeting held on 31.08.2018. Out of 25 selected candidates, 15 candidates have joined the university as on 07.09.2018 on different posts and the remaining are likely to join in a couple of days.
- 15. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that promotion under CAS for Assistant Professor from Stage–I to Stage–II has been held in the University recently and presented the details of faculty benefitted under CAS.
- 16. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members about academic and research developments in the university. He informed the members that the university has signed MoUs at national & international level, various Training programs/ Workshops/ Lectures/ FDPs have been regularly held by all the Departments of the university.
- 17. The Vice Chancellor informed the members about Community College of the university. Prof. L.K. Verma, apprised the members that Community College was started in the year 2016. The university has partnered with VLCC for providing training under one year Diploma in Beauty & Wellness

program. He further informed that 100% placement of students has been done who have completed their Diploma.

- 18. The Vice Chancellor also informed that since August, 2016, the university has been conducting evening coaching classes for various Central and State Civil Services Examinations for SC, ST, OBC & Minority candidates in the light of Govt. of India guidelines issued from time to time. The first batch was started in September, 2016 wherein 178 candidates were trained, out of which 22 candidates qualified the examination. In September, 2017, 2nd Batch of 78 candidates was trained, out of which 18 candidates qualified the examination. In 2018, coaching for State Civil Services is in progress and 51 candidates belonging to SC, ST, OBC and Minority are being trained free of cost.
- 19. The Vice Chancellor informed that a three month Certificate course in Yoga has been started in the university. Every year, one month long yoga camp was organised by the Yoga Department which was sponsored by Central Council for Research in Yoga and Naturopathy (Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India). He further informed that a 100 bedded hospital has been sanctioned by the Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India to the university.
- 20. The Vice Chancellor delighted to inform the members that the university has been sanctioned Centre for Space Science and Applications by the ISRO, Hqrs. New Delhi. The Vice Chancellor thanked Dr. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble MoS, (Independent Charge) for the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region, Prime Minister Office, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Department of Atomic Energy and Department of Space; and Dr. Radhakrishnan, Former ISRO Chairman, for their support for establishing Centre for Space Science and Applications at Central University of Jammu. The Vice Chancellor informed the house that the Central University of Jammu is the only university in the North India to have Centre for Space Science and Applications. He also informed that Dr. K. Radhakrishnan, Former ISRO Chairman, visited the university on 31.08.2018 to attend the 14th meeting of the Executive Council. During his visit, he informed that ISRO will initially release 20 crores for five years. The associated infrastructure will be provided by the university. The ISRO will provide fellowships to JRF/SRF and PDFs. He further informed that a MoU between ISRO and Central University of Jammu, shall be signed soon. He also suggested that the name of this Centre may be given after the name of Late Prof. Salish Dhawan, former Chairman ISRO and legendary Indian Aerospace Engineer, who belonged to the Jammu & Kashmir state. - 21. The Vice Chancellor informed the house about the Fellowships done by the faculty of the university:
 - **a. Dr. Anita Singh**, Assistant Professor, Department of Environmental Sciences, has completed her Raman Fellowship in University of Georgia, Georgia, USA. She has joined back the university on 5th March, 2018.
 - **b. Dr. Shweta Yadav**, Assistant Professor, Department of Environmental Sciences, has completed her Full-Bright Kalam Climate Fellowship in North Carolina State University, Raleigh, USA. She has joined back the university on 4th Sept. 2018.
 - **c. Dr. Neerender Kumar**, Assistant Professor, M.Tech. Computer Science & Technology, has completed his Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship programme from John von Neumann, Faculty of Informatics, Obuda University, Budapest, Hungary. He has joined back the university on 31st July, 2018.
 - **d. Dr. Jeganathan,** Assistant Professor, Department of National Security Studies, is a visiting scholar for conducting research on "One belt One Road" under Belt and Road Visiting Scholars program held in Fudan University, Shanghai, China.
- 22. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members about the functioning of the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of the university established in the year 2015. He appreciated Dr. Jeganathan for his outstanding contribution in NSS, Empanelled Training Institute (ETI) for NSS, Community Engagement activities, etc. He informed that a MoU has also been signed with the National Council for Rural Institutes (NCRI). The NCRI has been sponsoring one student every year for pursuing Ph.D. in rural development, rural community.
- 23. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members about the community & rural development initiatives of Govt. of India, like Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA). He informed that the university has adopted Jhang Panchayat under UBA and Dr. Rouchi Choudhary, Assistant Professor, Department of Public Policy and Public Administration, Central University of Jammu has been coordinating the activities under UBA program. Dr. Rouchi informed that under UBA flagship program, infrastructure for Language and Mathematics tutorial will be developed, libraries will be developed, computer literacy among adults & senior citizens will be provided to them.

- 24. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that Central University of Jammu has been invited three times at Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi. He informed that Dr. Pankaj Mehta, Assistant Professor, Department of Environmental Sciences & Coordinator University Innovation Cell (UIC), Central University of Jammu, represented the university at Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi and made a presentation before the Secretary to the President of India along with 03 NITs, 02 IITs and 01 other Central University in the year 2016. The Central University of Jammu figured in the book released by O.P. Jindal University. In the year 2017, Dr. Pankaj leaded the group of 08 Central Institutes of MHRD, Govt. of India, and again made a presentation before the Secretary to the President of India. He further informed that CUJ had obtained 02 Intellectual Property Rights from the Registrar, Copyright office of India on, a. Environmental Friendly recyclable duster, b. Medicinal and Aromatic plant diversity of CUJ. CUJ has also figured in the top 3000 start-ups of the country in a competition conducted on All India level by IIM Kolkata and Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
- 25. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that Jammu & Kashmir Bank has offered Rs.10 lakhs financial support for RFID technology for library of the University as a part of MoU signed between Central University of Jammu and Jammu & Kashmir Bank. He also informed that CUJ has signed multiple MoUs with J&K Bank for providing digitalisation, automation, and other services. The Vice Chancellor also informed that he had laid the foundation stone of J&K Bank in the campus for opening a Digital Lounge in the university shortly. He informed that J&K Bank has provided an Ambulance to the University under CSR initiatives besides offering 02 Gold Medals (1 Male & 1 Female) for toppers of the university, Smart Cards, Research Chair, Funding for Annual Business Festivals, etc.
- 26. The Vice Chancellor informed that the university has got resource mobilization to the tune of Rs. 28 crore 35 lakhs approx. from external agencies/organisations for supporting various academic activities, trainings, workshops, projects, etc. He also informed that 48 Research Programs in the university have been externally funded. The Vice Chancellor appreciated the efforts of the young faculty especially from sciences for catching up these research programs in a very short time.
- The Vice Chancellor apprised 27. the members that all technical/professional programs in the university are AICTE approved. The Page 10 of 18




AICTE had conducted inspection visits in the university in the past and approved five courses i.e. MBA (HRM), MBA (TTM), MBA (Marketing Management), M.Tech. Computer Science & Technology and B.Voc.(Tourism Management).

- 28. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members about various student support facilities provided by the university like ATM/Banks, Language labs, R.O. Water purifiers, separate hostels for boys & girls, medical support, smart cards, canteen, 2 Ambulances (1 at Campus, 1 at Hostel), etc.
- 29. The Vice Chancellor informed the house that construction work of 2 hostels of 100 bedded each for OBC, SC/ST boys and girls students has been going on and the Boys hostel will be handed over to the university by the CPWD by the end of December, 2018 and girls hostel will be handed over by December, 2019.
- 30. The Vice Chancellor informed the house that the HRM has been recognised as one of the National Resource Centre-HRM by the MHRD. The first meeting of the Academic Council of NRC was held on 10th Aug. 2018 at IIC, New Delhi. Course coordinators Dr. Jaya Bhasin and Dr. Shahid of the Department of Human Resource & Organizational Behaviour, CUJ, are coordinating the activities to be undertaken by the NRC. The mandate of the NRC is to provide online orientation/refresher courses to higher education faculty through MooCs platforms like SWAYAM. He further informed that Prof. T.V. Rao, Eminent Academician will act as mentor for the resource centre.
- 31. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that the university has signed International MoU with Deakin University, Australia. The Vice Chancellor informed that on the directions of the MHRD, the Central University of Jammu had signed MoU with Deakin University, Australia, in the presence of Sh. Prakash Javedkar, Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. Prof. Lokesh Kumar Verma, Academic Coordinator, Central University of Jammu, who was at Sydney at that time, attended the event at Australia on behalf of the University.
- 32. The Vice Chancellor informed that recently Ball University, USA, has collaborated with Central University of Jammu for Leadership through Sports programme for J&K State under US Mission India Public Diplomacy Grants.

- 33. The Vice Chancellor apprised the Chancellor and members about the infrastructural development of the university. He informed that the campus is spread over 610 acres of land which includes State's land/Evacuee's Property/Private land. Dr. Ashok Bhan enquired about the status of construction of boundary wall/fencing in the periphery of the university. The Vice Chancellor informed that the university has submitted proposal to the UGC for allotment of funds for the above said work.
- 34. Dr. Ashok Bhan enquired from the Vice Chancellor about the students enrolment in the university. The Vice Chancellor informed that in the last academic year 2017-18 there were 1183 students and the admissions for the academic year 2018-19 are under progress.
- 35. Dr. Bhan also enquired about the progress of construction of Academic Blocks in the university. The Vice Chancellor informed that due to nonavailability of funds for construction works, the projects of Academic Blocks have not been taken up. He further informed that due to his strenuous efforts, funds to the tune of Rs.127 crores have been agreed by MHRD after a gap of more than three years but UGC has not yet released this grant. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that due to poor planning of the infrastructure development of the university before he had taken over the charge of Vice Chancellor, priority works had been ignored and less priority works were taken up resulting in huge wasteful expenditure on unwanted buildings and projects in the initial stages of campus development. The UGC had not released any amount for construction works to the university due to the inquiry going on by the Visitorial Inquiry Committee for existing construction works carried out in the university. The Vice Chancellor further informed that as soon as the funds released from the UGC, the construction work of Academic Blocks will be taken up.
- 36. Dr. Ashok Bhan asked the Vice Chancellor to put up the outcomes/results yielded out of each of the MoU signed by the university in the next meeting.
- 37. Dr. Ashok Bhan enquired about the reasons for holding interviews of Non-Teaching posts on 29th & 30th August, 2018 and subsequently the meeting of the Executive Council was held on 31st August, 2018. Dr. Ravi Kumar, Registrar, CUJ, informed that the recruitment process of Nonteaching posts has been started a year before. The University has devised a 2-3 Tier criteria for selection of Non-teaching posts of Group A, B and C. The written tests were conducted on 23rd- 24th December, 2017 and 7th January,

2018. The skill tests were conducted from $12^{th} - 30^{th}$ July, 2018. Thereafter, the interviews for Group A posts were held on 29^{th} and 30^{th} August, 2018 and no interviews were held for Group B & C posts as per the guidelines of Govt. of India. The university has adopted a transparent and fair recruitment process for all these posts.

- 38. Prof. Manoj Dhar proposed that PG courses and Research in Biotechnology may be started in CUJ as these courses are not offered in Jammu.
- 39. Dr. G. Parthasarathy, Chancellor advised house for the following:
 - (i) Employment opportunities should be the main focus behind any course of study at CUJ
 - (ii) Technical courses which have better prospects in employment may be started in the University.
 - (iii) The University should look into the new technological innovation, but aim and vision should be beyond that for next generations.
 - (iv) Adopt new technologies in all the courses which have better job opportunities.
 - (v) The University should develop labs as per new technologies.
 - (vi) Plan the courses in Social Sciences so as to uplift the society by mutual cooperation and absorb the different cultures.
- 40. Thereafter, the Vice Chancellor made a Power Point Presentation with regards to the activities and achievements of the University.
