



Message of the Vice Chancellor



As the juggernaut of Higher Education is taking rapid strides in the country with the implementation of NEP-20, presenting the 11th Annual Report of Central University of Jammu for the session 2021-2022 instils in me a special sense of fulfilment coupled with self- reflection. It is gratifying to share that the University in a decade of existence has carved a niche both in academics and research at the regional and at the national level which makes it imperative to self-scrutinize as the Annual Report serves as an authentic document of introspection for chalking out a blueprint for future course of action.

The report is an objective reflection of our initiatives and accomplishments for the session 2021-2022 and comprehensive glimpse of a gamut of academic activities, research output and innovative teaching pedagogy which ostensibly presents the campus bustling with holistic learning and academic rigour. During the academic session 2021-22, the University offered 54 programmes: 19 Post Graduate, 18 research oriented, 04 Five Year integrated Degree, 01 Four Year Integrated, and 03 Vocational Programmes at Under-graduate level under the aegis of 19 Departments and 2 Centres. Moreover, in the year 2022, the prestigious Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science with entire funding from Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) was inaugurated.

Braving constraints and odds, which ostensibly are a part of an institution's development journey, the University is equally concerned about its nationalistic bonding aptly reflected in the pan-Indian ethos of the University as students from different states of the country are the proud learners, achievers and innovators. The University has so far awarded 81 Ph.D degrees; 108 M.Phil. degrees whereas 271 Ph.D scholars across 19 Departments and 02 Centres are pursuing their research programmes. The University has able to mobilize resources from various funding agencies for research. The university faculty has been awarded prestigious National/International Fellowships, Project funding and recognition and has constantly been contributing to various governmental and nongovernmental sectors through research, consultancy and outreach activities. At present, more than 56 major/minor research projects of academic and social relevance are undertaken by the faculty members. The faculty members have been able to mobilise numerous extra-mural funding from different funding agencies viz. National Board of Higher Mathematics, Department of Atomic Energy, GOI, SERB, UGC, ICSSR, DST, IUAC, M/O Textile, Gol, DelTY, GOl, MSME, Gol, M/O New and Renewable Energy, Gol, EDII, Ahmedabad, etc.

Understandably, the academic rigour needs to be supplemented with state-of-the art infrastructure and facilities. Hence, with Wi-fi facility on the campus and in hostels, an automated library, basic sports infrastructure, yoga classes, various clubs and interactive sessions, etc., the students of the University succeed in obtaining high quality holistic education and also earn prestigious placements. The thrust of the University has admirably been on inculcating basic human values and standards through diverse programmes and courses being currently offered.



The University has signed numerous National and International MoU's with eminent institutions and industries such as Kiel University, Germany; Dr. Ambedkar Foundation; TIFAC; Prevest Den Pro; Exigo Recycling Pvt. Ltd.; Vigyan Prasar, Dept.of Science and Technology, GoI; and others.

Commensurating with the thrust of National Education Policy on start-ups and online teaching-learning, national agenda and local requirements for inculcating entrepreneurial skills among students and the local population, the University has established Institution Innovation Council and University Business Incubation Centre for fostering start-up culture. The growth of the University clearly reflects a visible upward graph in the area of teaching and learning, quality research and publication. This progressive developmental trend is quite visible in infrastructural and support facilities. The university is coming up with some innovative schemes for empowering students, like Earn-while your- Learn; Alumni Endowment Fund etc. Further, the University is successful in qualitatively enhancing basic facilities in the class rooms in the form of smart teaching rooms and extensive use of ICT for multiplier effect in all its multidimensional activities.

Another notable strength of the University is the committed faculty hailing from different parts of the country. Many innovative proposals for enhancing the educational opportunities in varied fields of specialisations have been submitted by faculty and some are in the pipeline to augment the knowledge production in tune with national interests and goals.

The challenges, undoubtedly are an elixir of higher educational institutions and the real catalyst is the goodwill and unflinching commitment of all stakeholders: faculty, scholars, students, administrative staff and helping staff. With perseverance, honest work, camaraderie and goodwill, the Central University of Jammu is all bound to attain new pinnacles of glory in the year ahead.

TEN YEARS OF CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

In the year 2022, Central University of Jammu has entered a decade of its existence as an institution of higher learning. With interwoven learning and stimulation of critical thinking as its mantra, Central University of Jammu is a seat of learning equipping students with life skills and making them learn in a holistic manner. With new specialised courses in tune with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, various programmes of the university have been curated with a multifaceted approach wherein thrust has been laid on interdisciplinarity, skill development and online teaching-learning process.

INCEPTION AND CORE IDEALS

The Central University of Jammu came into existence on August 08, 2011, through the Central Universities Act, 2009 (Act No.25 of 2009 read with the Central Universities Act, 2009). The University campus is a fast developing and growing site at Village Bagla, Rahya-Suchani in District Samba, approximately 25 kms south of Jammu.

The motto of the university, बुद्धिर्ज्ञानिन शुध्येहती is a powerful futuristic mantra of CUJ resonating too well with the raison de etre of university, which is, knowledge refines, purifies and sharpens the mind. The logo of the university is illustrated as under:

The University has the requisite state-of -the -art class rooms, computer labs, research labs and competent faculty. It has a spacious canteen, a play ground and a health center managed by senior medical officers appointed by the University. The campus is networked having wired and wireless Internet facility. The University is having NKN (National Knowledge Network) connectivity of bandwidth of 1 GBPS. The virtual classroom setup is also in place which is connected through NKN connectivity with other academic and research institutes.





Academic Structure and Curricular Aspects

The Central University of Jammu presently has eight schools and two independent centres. They cover multidisciplinary subjects ranging from Languages, Literatures, Social Sciences, management studies and Sciences. The university makes concerted efforts to enhance its excellence in teaching, research and extension activities.

The course contents of the academic programmes is designed with a view to cater to the needs of its stakeholders by providing them extended horizon. The structure of every curriculum includes ICT enabled innovative teaching and learning, laboratory experiments (where ever applicable), presentations, in-house seminars, assignments, self-study and dissertations.

Efforts are constantly made to redesign the courses keeping in view the changing priorities of technology, industry and as well as methods of imparting knowledge and its implementation. These initiatives of updating and upgrading the course content are undertaken by the Boards of Studies of the concerned Centre and Department with inputs from distinguished external members drawn from premier academic and scientific institutions across the country. The exercise aims at providing cutting edge exposure and advantage to the courses offered by the university. This makes University graduates globally competent with an emphasis on employability and social and economic relevance in terms of national priorities.

Having introduced the Choice Based Credit System scheme right since its inception, the university incorporates much desired academic flexibility in its courses with ample scope for inter and intra disciplinary choice of courses across the departments and centres in the form of core compulsory, core elective and foundation courses.





The university has set up a formal mechanism at a place to elicit students' feedback on the course structure and content. An analysis of the feedback received from students together with observations and inputs from external experts provide a concrete basis for refining, revising and updating the curricula and pedagogy.

In consonance with objectives and obligations stated in the document of its establishment, the university offers courses and undertakes research in the areas like internal security, national security,

Teaching - Learning and Evaluation

The University adopts transparency in all its academic and evaluation transactions and ensures wide publicity to all available academic programmes. Admissions to all programmes offered by the university is granted through the Common University Entrance Test conducted by National Testing Agency, Ministry of Education, Govt of India. The Central University of Jammu is the first university of its type among the newly established central universities to conduct the online admission process. The whole process is monitored by the Central Admission Committee comprising the Controller of Examinations, Deans of the Schools, faculty members from different schools and one member each representing the categories of SC, ST, OBC, Women and the Minority. The university organizes the Orientation/ Induction programme at the outset of the academic semester to apprise new entrants about the university, salient features of a course that may be opted and opportunities open to them on completion of a course.





The academic calendar is being followed by all Schools and Departments and all possible measures are ensured to make the learning process student-centric. Most of the teaching-learning methodologies are the ICT based. The e-learning facilities are easily accessible to all students through the LAN connectivity round the clock. The faculty members ensure a culture of creativity among the learners.



Teachers are encouraged to participate in the prestigious international and national academic events which enable them to interact with eminent academics.

The University follows a transparent and standard system of examination by evaluating progress of the students through continuous internal assessment at the centre/school level and external assessment by the university at the end of the semester. The UGC guidelines are followed for evaluation of students.

Research and Development

Research and Development is the major thrust of the university. Many departments and centres offer research programmes with interdisciplinary approach. In order to facilitate smooth implementation of research projects, the university:

- encourages and support proposal submissions in various subjects.
- simplifies procedure related to sanctions/purchases made by the investigators.
- ensures timely release of grants.
- makes timely audit and submission of utilization certificate to the funding authorities.

Infrastructural Facilities, Cells/ Centres and Annual Activities

Faculty Rooms and Cabins

Faculty has well equipped IT-enabled offices providing them all facilities for pursuing academic and research activities.

Well-equipped auditorium with a seating capacity of 170 is a favorable space created for organsing seminars/ conferences and student related cultural and literary activities.

• Committee Room

A state-of-the-art Committee room in the Academic building has been set up for meetings, seminars and in-house discussions.

Health Centre

Medical facilities with full time senior medical officers and nursing staff have been made available for the students, staff and faculty of the University at its campus.

Canteen / Cafeteria

The University has a spacious, airy canteen where students and teaching faculty relish the neat and clean eatables prepared under hygienic conditions at its campus.

Hostels / Halls of Residence

The University has one boy's hostel (100 bed) and one girl's hostel (100 bed) under construction. At present the university has hired, private buildings on monthly rent basis in Jammu city to accommodate out station students. Depending on availability, these are allotted to the students on merit and distance basis.

1. Classrooms and Lecture Theatres

The University has adequate number of classrooms and lecture theatres to cater to the present needs of the various academic programmes. The classrooms are well furnished and equipped with requisite multimedia aids for teaching such as smart boards and smart panels.



2. Library

The University has fully automated library. The library is stacked with adequate number of books, journals and reference materials related to the various disciplines/programmes of study offered by theUniversity. Prominent among e-journals subscribed through e-ShodhSindhu: Consortium for Higher Education Electronic Resources and Science Direct.



It holds about 27850 books and 261 ebooks, and subscribes to over online learned



journals and over 5897 e-journals. The library is fully automated using Koha software for library operations and services. Central Library uses RFID technology system for security of books theft and it provides self-check- in and self check out facility for circulation section.



Central Library provides off-campus access through INFED remote access software of e-



journals and databases.

3. Internet & ICT Labs

The University is equipped with seamless Wi-Fi connectivity and students can access the Internet through their own laptops from anywhere in the Campus. The University also has three state-of-the-art ICT Labs equipped with high-end PCs loaded with necessary softwares accessible to the students.

4. University Business Incubation Centre (UBIC)

The University Business Incubation Centre (UBIC) has been set up and has been functional since 2015 under the aegis of Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship Council sponsored by M/O MSME, GoI to foster a culture of entrepreneurship amongst students as well as local population. The aim and the focus of the Incubation Centre is to nurture innovative ideas for commercialization and to provide infrastructural support to incubatees.

UBIC nurtures the innovative ideas of existing and prospective entrepreneurs in emerging innovative ventures by providing necessary mentoring, promoting IP ecosystem and providing entrepreneurs a platform to commercialize their ideas besides helping to raise the seed capital from different financial institutions at subsidized rates and IP protection. Also, Campus Start up track has been initiated for promoting innovation. In this line, Rs 25000/- cash prize has been announced by UBIC for promoting best innovative ideas having commercial relevance. In order to create awareness about entrepreneurship and sensitizing students about various schemes of GOI, a Lecture Series has been initiated by the UBIC and UIC wherein experts from diverse fields along with successful entrepreneurs



are invited to deliver alectures.

5. Industry-Academia Interface

The University has signed MoUs with various industries, reputed institutes /universities within the country and abroad which include MoUs with Chamber of Commerce and Industries, Jammu, VLCC, NASSCOM Foundation, New Delhi, Ashray Incubator, Ahmedabad, ASCI, Hyderabad. The University has also obtained membership of apex industrial organizations viz. ISTD, IAOTA, CII, NHRDN, AIMA, United Nation Academic Impact (UNAI) etc. This linkage has led to creating a strong industry-academia interface for the benefit of the students and the faculty. The University has initiated Eminent Lecture Series wherein prominent personalities and experts are invited periodically for interaction with students and faculty.

The University has also initiated a unique Corporate Immersion & Leadership Development Programme with an objective to sensitize the professionals towards the grass root level understanding of industry that attempts to connect classroom learning with real time environment.

6. Co-Curricular Activities

Facilities for sports and other co-curricular activities are available at the University Campus. These include outdoor games such as cricket, football, volleyball, badminton and basketball. Besides, facilities for indoor games like table tennis, chess and carom are also available.

7. NSS Activities

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit was created in the Central University of Jammu in 2015 in order to engage students in co-curricular activities such as community development and awareness programmes. The Unit has enrolled more than 120 volunteers from various departments of the University. It has organized various activities: Blood Donation Camp, Visit under PRA (Participatory Rural Appraisal), Participation in Youth Festival, Republic Day Celebrations, Digital India Workshop etc.

8. Gymnasium

The University has established fully equipped gymnasium in the Main Campus.

9. Combined Coaching Classes

The University is also providing coaching classes of Combined Central and State Services Preliminary Examinations to the students of the University as well as students from outside the University with due number of seats for the SC, ST, OBC & PwD Students.

10. PG Diploma Course in Yoga

The University has started One year PG Diploma course in Yoga w.e.f Academic session



2018 for the benefit of the students.

11. Udaan

University organizes cultural festival UDAAN wherein students showcase their talents in various areas like Singing, Dancing, Painting, Rangoli making etc.

12. Students Progression to Higher Education

Many students of Central University of Jammu are pursuing higher degrees in reputed institutions like Delhi University, Hanyang University (South Korea), ENSCBP Bordeaux (France), Jamia Milia Islamia, Punjabi University, MANNU (Hyderabad), University of Estonia, IIT Jodhpur, NIT Srinagar, Central University of Rajasthan, IIT Indore etc. University students are showing excellence in their careers by pursuing their higher education from all these reputed institutions.

13. Transport Facility

The University is providing a shuttle service to the students of the University from the main Campus to Rahya and back. Further, University is also providing staff bus service to the staff of the University.

14. Conference Facility

The University has well-equipped facilities for conferences, workshops, and seminars with seating capacity ranging from 50 to 200 persons.

15. Non-NET Fellowships

All the students enrolled for Ph.D. programmes are eligible to receive a monthly fellowship through the UGC Non-NET fellowship initiative. The University follows the guidelines by the relevant funding bodies for Fellowship as prescribed from time to time.

16. Welfare Schemes for SC/ST, Minority and Girl Students

The welfare schemes notified and implemented by the Government of India and UGC are followed in the University and the schemes, announced from time to time, are introduced within the University as applicable.

17. Directorate of Physical Education

Directorate of Sports and Physical Education addresses the indispensable need of physical activities and organizes annual sports festival Combatica, wherein students participate with gusto. A multi-gym facility is available on campus. University has also tied up with Sports Authority of India (SAI), Gandhinagar for sports facilities.



18. Placement Cell

The University has established a Placement and Training Cell which is responsible for the interface between the University and possible recruiters.



STRENGTHS OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

Guided by the reforms agenda in higher education, New Education Policy 2020 and learning from the experiences of the best universities of the world, the University has introduced a number of innovations as detailed below:

• Semester-Based Academic Calendar

All academic programmes of the University, Integrated Masters' Degree, Masters' Degree and Ph.D. programme are conducted as per the UGC guidelines and designed at par with global practices in terms of effective number of teaching days and teaching learning inputs. All admitted candidates in Ph.D. programmes undergo mandatory coursework of six months duration.

Programmes Based on Comprehensive Choice Based Credit System

The University has adopted Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per the UGC guidelines and prepared a blueprint for the implementation of NEP 2020 during the period under report.

Innovative Approach in Designing Programmes of Studies

The Programmes of Studies offered by the University have been designed with an objective of making students globally competitive in their respective fields. The focus is on the Learner- Centred Approach as opposed to the conventional Teacher Centred



Approach to accommodate learner's needs and expectations to have wider choices in content, mode and pace of learning.

• Inter-disciplinary Programmes of Studies

The Academics Departments of the University are designed around basic disciplines to enable faculty members to focus on their specialized areas of research. Each programme of Study of the University is inter-disciplinary that empowers the students to accumulate required number of credits from a wide variety of courses offered by other departments of the University as well.

Evaluation Process for all Academic Programmes

Students in all programmes of studies across disciplines and at all levels are assessed through Continuous Internal Assessment based on quizzes, assignments, independent works, group work, mid-semester and end-semester examinations. Each Department offers minimum four activities out of a list of activities to assess the performance of the students through wide variety of activities under continuous Internal Assessment. The evaluation process comprises the following:

Continuous Internal Assessment 25% Mid-Semester Examination 25% End-Semester Examination 50%






Gender wise, category wise and state wise representation of students admitted to various programs of study in the Academics session 2021-22 in UG & PG Programmes:

Under Graduate & Post Graduate Students (Category wise – gender, SC/ST/OBC/PWD):




State wise representation of students admitted to Master's Degree programme 2021-2022






Gender wise, category wise and state wise representation of Ph.D. Scholars admitted in the Academics Session 2021-22 in Ph.D Programmes:

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS WING

The Finance and Accounts Wing function as per provisions of Central Universities Act, 2009 relevant Ordinances and under the directions of Finance Committee and Executive Council. The day-to-day function of the Wing is supervised by Finance Officer under the direction of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. The Wing exercises general supervision over funds of the University and advises Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Finance Committee and Executive Council regarding financial policy of the University within the framework of relevant Government of India rules. Also, it performs other financial functions as assigned by Competent Authority. Main function of the Wing includes preparation of Annual Budget under the supervision of Finance Committee and Executive Council, exercise internal control, Internal Audit and processing of payments. The Annual Accounts and Balance Sheet of the University is prepared every year by Finance Wing under the Direction of Finance Committee and Executive Council. The Annual Accounts of the University are audited every year by the C&AG of India. The audited Annual Accounts are presented to the Court, Finance Committee, and Executive Council before onward submission to MoE to be placed before both the Houses of Parliament.

Responsibilities at the Wing have been assigned to four desks namely: Budget and Finance Section, Accounts Section, Bill and Payment Section and Internal Audit Section. At present, there are 02 Section officers, 01 Private Secretary and 04 staff deputed to discharge different responsibilities at the Wing.

Major Highlights

- a. University has achieved the target set up by the MoE for 100 percent cashless transactions from the F.Y 2019-20.
- b. Implemented the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) a web based online software developed by Controller General of Accounts (CGA) to release and track payment.
- c. University has implemented the disbursement of payment from Treasury Single Accounts (TSA), held by RBI through PFMS portal.
- d. The University has constituted a Standing Audit Committee to address all the Audit Para.
- e. HEFA Loan processed, approved and sanctioned by MoE of Rs. 123.00 Cr.
- f. Maintaining digital cash book through Tally Software.
- g. The Wing is working on complete computerization of financial management and accounting system.

COMMITTEES AND CELLS

A. Grievance Redressal Committee for Non-Teaching employees and for Students:

The University has set up SC/ST/PwD Cell and OBC Cell to look after the issues of the candidates of the community / category related to Admission, Employment and other Grievances. The following activities & meetings have been conducted under SC/ST cell at Central University of Jammu.

- a. Category certificate verifications of students have been done at the time of admissions of all the departments of the university.
- b. Queries during admissions regarding SC/ST seats available were resolved on spot.
- c. Time to time Admission committees / Recruitment committees has been formulated and revised to ensure the presence of SC/ST representative in every committee.
- d. Time to time meetings have been conducted on University Roster.
- e. Meeting has also been conducted for incorporation of Economically Weaker Section (EWS) in the University Roster.

C. Gender Sensitization Committee Against Sexual Harassment (GSCASH):

The University is committed to create a conducive workplace environment, for its employees, faculties, students and research scholars which is free from any form of physical, mental or sexual harassment.

GSCASH (Gender Sensitization Against Sexual Harassment) is functioning at Central University of Jammu with Apex Body of GSCASH and ICC (Internal Complaints Committee). It is actively engaged in organizing various activities including Sensitization Programme and Counselling. Women Empowerment has been taken into consideration at each step.

Events and Activities:


- An official Facebook page @odswcujammu is being maintained to reach out to the students through social media and keep the students updated about events and other information of concerns during pandemic times and near future.



Further, a meeting was held between faculty and industry experts about changing industry expectations and ways to strengthen industry academia ties.


The possibility of summer internships and industrial visit was also discussed with the team.

Social work is an interdisciplinary course based on the humanitarian principle of social justice, human rights, equality and solidarity with the vision of creating an egalitarian society. Amelioration of human sufferings with a scientific outlook lies at the helm of this course. It is a multidisciplinary course which is driven by the theories from disciplines like sociology, psychology, economics, philosophy, anthropology and environmental science. The course utilizes scientific methods that can be applied while dealing with problems at the individual, group and community level.

Social work is a practice-based profession which emphasizes upon the inculcation of ethics and values amongst the students while working with people in practical settings. It is because of this purpose, continuous training throughout the course becomes its essential feature. Social work students get engaged in extensive and rigorous field work training within the community with direct interventions or through various national and international developmental organizations and government institutions. It eventually equips the students to address various social issues and concerns.

Social work programme at Central University of Jammu was introduced at Post Graduation level in the year 2014 with current intake capacity of 45 students from diverse disciplines. Selections are made through national level CUCET entrance examination annually. Department also run PhD Programme since 2018.

Currently the department has total faculty strength of four Assistant Professors from diverse academic backgrounds and specializations.

A. Building Committee

21st meeting of the Building Committee of the Central University of Jammu was held on 23rd Dec, 2021 in the Campus of Central University of Jammu, Rahya-Suchani Bagla. The resolutions of the meeting are given below:-

- 1) Construction of ESS 3&4 to be started on priority.
- 2) The project cost for the purpose of payment to M/s SAA and M/s EPIL to be taken as the tender cost i.e. Rs. 690.00 Cr. not Rs. 1049 as claimed by them in view of the report received from Ministry of Education and accounts to be settled accordingly.
- 3) Process for the transfer of 610 Acre of land in the name of University to be initiated in view of removal of Article-370.
- 4) The Building Committee approved the change in location of HEFA funded projects as per MoM of joint site visit of CPWD and CUJ officials so as to reduce the cost of construction to the maximum possible extent by reducing the height of retaining walls and external development without any adverse effect on the building structural stability. It is also recommended to explore other sites of other buildings also.
- 5) The committee resolved that the Library Block under HEFA projects shall inhouse the Administration Block also. The area of the building shall be of same size as originally envisaged without any escalation in the cost.
- 6) University shall float EoI for hiring of new PMC for the development of Infrastructure as same was approved as Item No: BC-18/04 in the 18th Building Committee for all upcoming construction infrastructure development.

The Central University of Jammu took possession of the entire stretch of land measuring 4880 Kanal 19 Marlas which was handed over by the State Govt. to the University. The University has undertaken the following works for development of the permanent Campus in the Phase-I at Rahya - Suchani (Bagla) in Samba. These developmental works amount to an expenditure to the tune of Rs.376.33 Crores (which includes PMC and Architects fees) and are in different stages of execution.

Achievements of Engineering Section during the Period:

- 1) Central Water Receiving Station (CWRS) of Capacity 12, 60,000 Ltrs completed.
- 2) Elevated Water Station-I (EWS-I) of capacity 11,88,000 ltrs completed.
- 3) Elevated Water Station-II (EWS-II) of capacity 2,40,000 ltrs completed.
- 4) ESS-1 & ESS-2, and Compact Substation (CSS-1,2&3) completed by June-2020
- 5) Construction of School of Education given to CPWD for Rs. 5.41 Cr. The construction work has been started since 20-12-2019, having built up area 1890 Sqm and now in the final stage of completion.
- 6) Construction of Boundary wall along with the periphery of CUJ, Bagla having length of 13.50 KM (approx.) for Rs 25.00 Crores given to CPWD. The work was allotted to M/s Charanji Lal Gupta & Sons and the work has been started since 07-12-2019. The CPWD has foreclosed the work and is in process of retendering the work.
- 7) The construction of SATISH DHAWAN CENTRE FOR SPACE SCIENCE (SDCSS) funded by ISRO at Central university of Jammu, Rahya-Suchani (Bagla) Distt. Samba has been completed and the building has been commissioned.
- 8) The University has appointed new principal Architect for the construction of Kalam Centre for Science & Technology (KCST) funded by DRDO.
- 9) The University is in process of appointing new PMC for construction of HEFA funded buildings viz. School of Basic & Applied Sciences, 500 bedded Boys hostel, 500 bedded Girls Hostel, Library cum Administrative Building.
- 10) The construction of 33/11 KVA 2X10 MVA receiving station for dedicated electric supply to Central University of Jammu has started.



UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The University Health Centre was established in December 2012 in Temporary academic block at Sainik Colony. In 2018 it was permanently shifted to main campus. Presently the health centre is functioning from quarter no.6 in main campus Bagla adjacent to Hindi Department with Two rooms and a lobby accommodation. It is five beded facilities with all basic necessities.

The main objective of the Centre is to provide primary prevention against diseases, and to take care of routine health problems.

The health centre has an efficient and well – trained staff as medical officers, staff nurse, pharmacist, dresser and Peon

Free medical check – up is carried out for the staff members and the students of the University. Free medication is also provided for general and common ailments.

University health centre carries out detailed evaluation of all aspects, especially for Hypertension and Diabetes Mellitus. It maintains separate files for all the enrolled patients. Regular check up, necessary investigations, counselling, health education, necessary advice and treatment are provided free of cost to all other patients.

In view of Covid -19 emergency , period under report, has been punctuated by lockdowns and unlocks. In the unlock period, patients have been attended, given treatment, referred To 'CGHS' hospitals, wherever, required. While during the Government issued lockdowns, patients have been attended via electronic mode of communication.

Besides, during the current pandemic, attended faculty, staff and students for Covid related issues –namely sampling, testing and similar matters related to Covid Management.

Also coordinated, in supplying medical aid, and hospitalization -for cases having such a requirement.

Functioning of Health Centre:-

University health centre functions from 9:30am to 5:30 on all working days. Medical officers and paramedical staff are on call 24x7 on all days for hostels to deal with any emergency.

Flagging off ceremony of "Source Apportionment study of Aerosols in Jammu" was held in the Campus on 6 April, 2021. Chief Guest, Suresh Chugh, Chairman, JKPCB and the then Vice Chancellor Prof. Ashok Aima inaugurated the air monitoring station. For this project, High volume samplers of latest technology will be installed at different signature sites viz. CUJ, Bari Brahmna, Vikram Chowk, Narwal and Kachhi Chawni for sampling of PM2.5 in Jammu.

This one-year rigorous sampling campaign will be followed by laboratory analysis of collected samples and receptor modelling to identify the major sources of air pollution in Jammu. The event was attended by Dean Prof. B. S. Bhau ,Prof. Sunil Dhar, HOD, EVS, Dean, Sciences, Prof. Devanand ,Dr. Ravi Kumar, Registrar, CU Jammu. Prof. S. N. Tripathi, IIT Kanpur, National Coordinator, NKN, NCAP was the guest of honor where as other knowledge partners Prof. B.R. Gurjar, IIT Roorkee, Prof. Suman Mor, Punjab University, Prof. Neeraj Rastogi, PRL, Prof. Khaiwal, PGI-Chandigarh, Prof. Sachin S. Webinar on National Tourism Day




