
University is an abode of boundless learning, knowledge and wisdom that paves the way to purposeful self-introspection, leading to individual growth and development.

Campus at a Glance

Introduction

The Central University of Jammu (CUJ) came into existence on August 08, 2011 and was established under the Central Universities Act, 2009 (Act No.25 of 2009 read with the Central Universities Act, 2009). The first academic session (2011-2012) commenced with three post graduate courses and at present university is offering 7 integrated/4 undergraduate/19 Postgraduate/23 Ph.D. and Certification programmes in Sciences, Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities and Management through different Schools and Departments. The University also offers B.Tech., M.Tech and Ph.D Program in the area of Computer Science and Engineering and Electronics and Communication Engineering. The University is fully functional from its campus located near Village Rahya – Suchani (Bagla) in District Samba of UT of J&K; approximately 24 km away from Jammu and its campus is well connected through local and state transport. Central University of Jammu epitomizes an inclusive and pluralistic institution of higher learning where the faculty and students are collectively committed to discover and share knowledge, as well as addressing the challenges that our world is faces.

The University is located in a picturesque campus sprawling over six hundred acres of land, and its Campus is dotted with various Teaching, Research, Library, Administration, Boys and Girls hostels and Residential quarters, Health Centre, Banks and other amenities, etc. in a natural setting. The University is having Satish Dhwan Centre for Space

Sciences funded by ISRO and DRDO, Industry Academia-Kalam Centre for Excellence funded by DRDO. The University has an Incubation Centre which runs under CUJ SITEC, a section 8 company. The research of the University is augumented by High end research facilities including SEM, XRD, PLD, FTIR, PL, DSE, TDA, AAS, BET Surface Area Analyse, GC-MS, Confocal Raman



Spectroscopes, NMR under Central Instrumentation Facility. The University is having HARI facilities working in the area of Aerosol for climatic changes in the Himalayan Regions.



Infrastructural Highlights

To meet the contemporary demands of many programmes, the University boasts state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities such as smart classrooms, well-equipped Research Laboratories, and Lecture Theatres. The University has a fully automated library that is stocked with an adequate number of books (both physical and electronic), journals (both physical and online), and reference materials relating to the many disciplines/programs of study provided by the University.

The University is equipped with seamless Wi-Fi 1GB connectivity and students can access the internet through their own laptops from anywhere in the Campus. The University also has the State of the art

The Central Library is using iThenticate and Drill Bit Extreme software for checking plagiarism of students and scholar thesis and articles.



The University has a spacious, airy canteen where students and teaching faculty get an opportunity to relish the neat and clean eatables prepared under hygienic conditions at its campus.




Banking and ATM Facilities

ATMs of HDFC and J&K Bank have been installed at the main campus building to facilitate students and faculty.



Research & Industry

To achieve research excellence, Central University of Jammu has undertaken 126 projects valued at Rs. 47.13 crore. Among these, 56 projects worth Rs. 31.88 crore have been completed, while 70 projects worth Rs. 15.25 crore are currently ongoing in the current academic session. These projects are funded by various agencies, including the National Board of Higher Mathematics, Department of Atomic Energy (GOI), SERB, UGC, ICSSR, DST, IUAC, Ministry of Textiles (GOI), DeITY (GOI), MSME (GOI), Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (GOI), and EDII, Ahmedabad, among others.



In terms of quality publications, patents, and intellectual property rights (IPR), faculty members and students have achieved a commendable position in the Nature Index Ranking, securing 49th place among universities in India for 2024. The Nature Index Ranking is renowned for its rigorous evaluation of research output across high-quality scientific journals, highlighting CU Jammu's significant contributions, particularly in the fields of Chemistry, Earth Sciences, Physical Sciences, and Life Sciences. To date, a total of 1,325 high-quality publications have been produced, alongside 17 patents and IPR filings, resulting in an H-index of 62 and a total of 20,645 citations as of January 2025. Over the past year, 1,491 quality papers have been published by the faculty and students at Central University of Jammu. This year, the university aims to strengthen the academic-industry interface, particularly focusing on industries in the northern region, especially in Jammu and Kashmir.

Additionally, the Central University of Jammu has established the CUJSITE Council (a Section 8 company) and Institute Innovation Cell (IIC), providing a platform for start-ups and innovations. The CUJSITE Council has also been awarded a project under the GENESIS SCHEME from a reputed institution.

Central Instrumentation Facility

The Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) has been established with the objective of providing sophisticated characterization services to the Industry, and researchers within and outside the Central University of Jammu. The CIF houses several high-end state-of-the-art instruments. It aims to provide a central facility consisting of the latest and advanced analytical Instruments to facilitate multidisciplinary research and to cater to the needs of academic research institutes, universities, and industries for high-end material characterization.



Academic Highlights

Central University of Jammu is slated towards striving excellence by focusing on various aspects that elevate the status and stature of education. A sound reflection with the changing times is the utmost intention of a growing institution. All programs offered by the University are in a state of continuous re-orientation and revamping in consonance with the New Education Policy, 2020. To ensure this, the University has ensured the following:

Innovative Programme Design

The University's Programmes have been created with the goal of making students worldwide competitive in their respective disciplines. The focus is on the 'Learner-Centric Approach' as opposed to the conventional 'Teacher-Centric Approach' to accommodate learner's needs and expectations to have wider choices in content, mode and pace of learning.

Experiential Learning

The University provides excellent ambience for Experiential learning which equips the students with practical skills, real world experience and competitive skills in their carrier through internships, field work, project base learning and simulations bridging the gap between the theoretical knowledge and professional applications. The technology led ancient Padeological intervention involving hands-on experiences and real life reflections to foster critical thinking, problem solving, ancient wisdom and adaptability highly valued by employers.

Adoption of Inter-disciplinary Approach of Learning

Each study program of the University is inter-disciplinary in approach as the student is empowered to accumulate required number of credits from a wide variety of courses offered by other Departments of the University. Crossdisciplinary study gives exposure to students in terms of holistic conceptualization of the realms of learning.

Academic Calendar based on Semester System

All academic programmes of the University viz. Certificate, Diploma, B.Voc, Undergraduate (UG), Integrated Programmes, Post Graduate (PG) are based on semester system, designed at par with global practices to encapsulate a more structured pattern and effective number of teaching days along with adequate teaching-learning inputs.

Inclusion of Comprehensive Choice Based Credit System

The University is following Comprehensive Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per UGC norms largely on the lines of the best Universities of the world.

Holistic Evaluation System for Academic Programs

Students enrolled in all disciplines of study are assessed through Continuous Internal Assessment based on quizzes, field projects, assignments, independent works, group work, Mid-semester and End-semester examinations. Each

Department offers minimum three activities out of a list of activities to assess the performance of the students through wide variety of activities under Continuous Internal Assessment to holistically evaluate the students.

Assessment & Evaluation

- a) The assessment of the candidate shall be based on (i) Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) throughout the semester, (ii) Mid Semester Examination, and (iii) End Semester Examination (ESE).
- b) The CIA is a continuous process spread over the semester and involves components as; assignments, quizzes, surprise test, case studies, presentations, attendance, etc. but informed the student starting of the semester.
- c) There shall be one mid semester examination as per the academic calendar. If any student does not appear in the mid semester examination due to any valid reasons (verified by concerned course coordinator, Head and Dean) shall be allowed to take re-mid semester examinations to be conducted before the commencement of the ESE.
- d) The assessment in End Semester Examination will be based on the performance in the End Semester Examination/Viva-Voce Examination/Presentation as the case may be by the student. The evaluation in theory courses which involves written examination shall be carried out by the concern faculty member whereas in case of practical's, projects, training, etc. it shall be carried (course coordinator) / (course coordinator and the external examiner).
- e) The assessment of a candidate in each subject shall be done on the basis of absolute grading basis as follows:

- f) Grades for theory, practical's, projects, etc. will be submitted to the department as per Academic Calendar after the end of classes of the respective semester. Grades will be awarded by the subject coordinator and shall be submitted to the department for further submission in examination section.
- g) The grades submitted by different programs may be moderated by a Departmental Moderation Committee, recommended through the concern HoD, and approved by the Dean of School/Vice-Chancellor, if required.

Fellowships for PG and Ph.D Students

Fellowships are the most important part of student support. Central University of Jammu assist the students and researchers in availing these fellowships by providing guidance to the students for clearing the National level exams for the fellowships. Researchers who are pursuing PhD and those who have cleared their UGC (JRF)/ GATE are availing the fellowships offered by University Grants Commission and Council for Scientific and Industrial Research. Various other fellowships availed by the University students are NGOBC, RGNF, Single Girl Child, Pahari Speaking, Post Matric Scholarship for SC/ST students, PMS-Minority etc.

State-of-the-art Facilities

The University offers various facilities on campus including library, gymnasium, canteen, hostel, sports facility, wi-fi connectivity and much more. The campus is both eco-friendly lush green and inviting equipped with all necessary facilities. Students enrolled in the University can benefit from these facilities without paying any membership charge.

Internship Embedded Skill Training Programme

The goal of this initiative is to provide Indian youth with skill training through sector-specific vocational education programmes. The Next-Generation Bachelor of Vocational [B.Voc.] programmes are offered under the University Grants Commission's (UGC) "National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF)" and AICTE to address critical knowledge and skill-set gaps required to make candidates "Industry Ready" and also shape "Young-entrepreneurs." The Bachelor of Vocational [B Voc.] programmes incorporate specific job roles and their equivalent National Occupational Standards (NOSs) along with broad-based general education. The Central University of Jammu currently offers three B. Voc. programmes namely B. Voc. (Tourism Management), B. Voc. (Retail Management) and B. Voc. (Banking & Finance).

The three-year degree programme begins with a Diploma course leading to a Bachelor of Vocational Degree [B.Voc.] in the 3rd year. B.Voc. programme offer multiple entry and exit options. As a course requirement, every B. Voc. student of Central University of Jammu is required to complete internships through 'Earn While You Learn' model. This 'Earn While You Learn' model provides students an opportunity to earn a modest stipend in skill knowledge sectors.

Opportunity for International Students

The following category of students from abroad viz Foreign Nationals, Non-Resident Indian (NRI) and Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) will be admitted to Central University of Jammu subject to the fulfilment of the following requirements under different UG/PG/Integrated and Ph.D. programmes.

In all the courses, a maximum of 25% seats may be filled as supernumerary seats over and above the total approved intake. Out of 25% supernumerary seats for foreign students 5% of such seats shall be earmarked for the Children of Indian workers in the Gulf and foreign student in this context shall be defined as the one who possesses a foreign passport; preference to be given to person of Indian origin holding foreign passport. However, in case of any vacancy under this category the vacant seats can be filled with other foreign students. There will be no written test or interview for admission. However, candidates shall have to fulfil the eligibility conditions for admission as laid down for the respective postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes given below.

Eligibility and Academic Qualifications

All foreign students/NRI/PIO should have passed the examination in the concerned subject and should fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria for admission as per the requirement of programme from a University/Board included in the list of Association of Indian Universities (AIU). In case the University/Board is not included in the said list, the candidate has to obtain and submit an equivalence certificate to this effect from AIU subject to its final verification by the respective Department. If the candidate has a non-Indian bachelor's degree not recognized by AIU/UGC/AICTE, he/she is required to produce proper certification from a national body in the country concerned, constituted for certifying equivalence of degrees.

Quality Education at Affordable Fees

Central University of Jammu has relatively low tuition fee that students from any background can afford. A major advantage of attending Central University of Jammu is that the fee of any programme is not excessively expensive for students to avail good quality education.



Admission 2025-26

General

Admission (for the session 2025-26 to all the Programmes of studies shall be made on the basis of merit through Central Universities Common Entrance Test (CUET) to be conducted by National Testing Agency.

In some courses the University may Conduct its own Entrance Test subject to approval of Competent Bodies of the University after conduct of (CUET)

For making admission to B.Voc. Programmes and Programmes of Studies under Community College the University shall follow the relevant UGC guidelines/regulations that may be in addition to / apart from the merit obtained through (CUET) in the respective courses.

For admission in Engineering courses, merit of JEE Mains, JOSSA / CSAB and equivalent will be considered.

Completion of Admission Formalities

A candidate shall be considered as admitted to a Programme of Study and be eligible to be bonafide student of the University only after he/she has completed all the required formalities for admission including payment of the prescribed fees. If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, he/she will automatically forfeit his/her right for admission.

List of selected candidates shall be displayed on the **University Website**. **No separate intimation to the selected candidates will be sent by post**. However, the candidates can see the status of their admission through the SMARTH Portal. The candidates shall be required to get their admissions completed by the dates as notified by the University from time to time and the candidates are advised to remain in touch with the University website www.cujammu.ac.in and other Admission related website that may be launched by the University (students are advised to be in regular touch with University website www.cujammu.ac.in for further updates). The selected candidates shall be required to produce, for verification at the time of reporting / last date prescribed for completion of the admission formalities, as the case may be the original documents thereof. In case of a candidate who is already in employment, No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the employer clearly mentioning that the employer has no objection in the candidates selection/admission for pursuing higher education in the respective discipline/Programme of study in the Central University of Jammu on regular basis. Such candidate (s) will be considered for admission only on production of a certificate from the employee that he/she has been granted leave for the prescribed duration in the University. Incase of a gap between the qualifying examination and the year seeking admission in the University for more than one year, the candidate shall be required to submit an undertaking indicating the reasons for such gap and the activities in which he/she was engaged during the intervening period. Candidates desirous of seeking admission to a Programme of Study in the Central University of Jammu are advised, in their own interest, to ensure that they have inserted the correct code of Central University of Jammu and the subject code allotted to a subject offered by the University, otherwise they will not be considered for admission by the University.

RESERVATION OF SEATS IN ADMISSION

- 1. The University shall follow reservation in admission as mandated under the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation of Seats) Act 2006, as amended from time to time.
- The University shall also follow reservation in admission in all Programmes of Study in accordance with the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act,1995 and The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act,2016.
- 3. Accordingly, the University shall reserve seats in all Programmes of Study for admission as under for the students belonging to:

Scheduled Caste (SC) Category	15.0%
Scheduled Tribe (ST) Category	7.5%
Other Backward Classes(OBC) Category– Non-creamy layer	27.0%
EWS (Economic Weaker Section)	10%

- 4. Each category will have 5% seats reserved for PWD Candidates as per Horizontal Reservation of Gol.
- 5. The candidates applying under the reserved categories shall need to submit the category Certificates (SC/ST/OBC Non-Creamy Layer Certificate/ EWS/PWD issued by the competent authority in the prescribed format at the time of submission of Application Form and produce the same in original for verification at the time of admission/registration. Non-Creamy Layer certificate should not have been issued earlier than six(6) months from the date of registration.
- 6. If a candidate in there served category qualifies for admission in the general category he/she shall be treated as a general category candidate. If sufficient number of candidates are not available to fill up the seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes, these may be filled up by suitable candidates from Scheduled Castes and vice-versa. If sufficient number of candidates are not available to fill up the seats reserved for OBCs, these may be filled up by suitable candidates from General Category.



Explanation: For the purpose of calculation of number of seats under a reserved category, fractions will be ignored. Candidates seeking admission under reserved categories shall be required to fulfill the prescribed conditions of admission criteria of the Programme of Study offered by the CUJ.

Other Supernumerary Seats: One seat each shall be reserved for:

- a) Outstanding Sportspersons viz:sportspersons of State/National/International repute insuitable courses to promote sports in the university
- b) National Cadet Corps
- c) NSS
- d) Wards of serving or retired Defense personnel as per national policy
- e) Wards of Central University of Jammu employees who are holding or have held substantive post.
- f) Single Girl child.
- g) Kashmiri Migrant
- h) Children who lost their parents during COVID Pandemic

Admission Criteria

Graduate/Master's Degree Programmes

Admission to all Programmes of studies shall be based on the merit of the students in Entrance Test obtained in (CUET-2025). No candidate under these provisions shall be considered for admission unless he/she has appeared in the (CUET-2025). Admission in Engineering shall be through CUET, JEE Mains, JOSAA / CSAB.

Admission Guidelines for International Students

International students in this context are defined as the one who possesses a foreign passport. In all the courses, a maximum of 25% supernumerary seats have been allocated for international students over and above the total sanctioned enrolment in each programme. The supernumerary seats for international students will not include the international students under exchange programmes or/and through Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between institutions or between Government of India and other countries.

International Students need to adhere to all existing rules/provisions notified by the Government of India regarding visa/Foreign Regional Registration Offices (FRRO) etc.

The International Students viz Foreign Nationals, Non-Resident Indian (NRI) and Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) will be admitted to Central University of Jammu through Study in India (SII) programme.

About the Study in India (SII) programme:

The Study in India (SII) programme is a flagship initiative launched by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India. The Study in India portal integrates dynamic features including student registration, generation of Unique Student ID, online application submission, visa processing and FRRO application process. The program aims to position India as a leading educational destination for international students. Interested international students from around the world may explore valuable educational prospects offered by Central University of Jammu in Academic year 2025-2026 on SII portal (www.studyinindia.gov.in).

Eligibility and Academic Qualifications

International Students seeking admission will have to satisfy the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to the various programmes of study. All foreign students/NRI/PIO should have passed the examination in the concerned subject and should fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria for admission as per the requirement of programme from a University/Board included in the list of Association of Indian Universities (AIU). In case the University/Board is not included in the said list, the candidate has to obtain and submit an equivalence certificate to this effect from AIU subject to its final verification by the respective Department. If the candidate has a non-Indian bachelor's degree not recognized by AIU/UGC/AICTE, he/she is required to produce proper certification from a national body in the country concerned, constituted for certifying equivalence of degrees.

CU Jammu SITEC/ University Business Incubation Centre



CU Jammu Startup Incubation and Technology Enablement Council (CUJammu SITE Council) has been formally registered as section 8 company with Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India in 2023 with formal objectives to act as University Business Incubation Centre at Central University of Jammu. The main objective is to nurture innovative ideas of students/faculty/staff of CU Jammu for commercialization. The specific aim is to formalize the innovative ideas of existing and prospective entrepreneurs in emerging and innovative domains. It is achieved by providing necessary initial prototyping grant, mentoring, promoting IP ecosystem and providing the entrepreneurs a platform to commercialize their ideas. Besides helping to raise the seed capital from different financial institutions, investment grants or collateral free highly subsidized loans are also facilitated.

The incubation centre is now known as CU Jammu Startup Incubation and Technology Enablement Centre (CUJ-SITEC), governed by University Council. CUJ SITEC works by hand in hand, with Institution Innovation Council (IIC), and various departments of Central University of Jammu.

In 2022-2023, 17 Patents have been filed and published by University students, faculty and employees. In addition, various innovation promoting programmes have been carried out by IIC, especially idea screening sessions and Hackathons. University also is facilitating innovative ideas and 5 ideas, made from the first phase to next phase, in 2023 with financial aid, with successful incorporation of one as a formal registered firm in the food-tech sector. The submission and screening of ideas is continuous and more details can be collected from www.cujsitec.in




Directorate of Physical Education

National Service Scheme

NSS Activities

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit was established in the Central University of Jammu in August 2015. Within brief period of time, the NSS Unit has climbing many heights including volunteer's participation in the "Regular Activities" like Education,



Health, Family Welfare and Nutrition, Social Service Programmes, Programmes for improving Status of Women etc. and National level special camping/events such as NSS Republic Day Parade Camp, National Youth Festivals (NYF), National Integration Camp (NIC) and National Adventures Camp (NAC). National Cadet Corps

NCC Activities

NCC Directorate JK&L introduced NCC in Central University Jammu in 2020 as a part of newly raised 4 J&K Battalion NCC Group Headquarters Jammu which spreads over Samba and Kathua Districts of the border area. Since the introduction of NCC unit in Central University of Jammu, the unit has taken various initiatives by celebrating : NCC day, Constitution day, participated in Blood Donation Camp, organized various events under the umbrella Mission Life (Lifestyle for Environment), G-20 and Y-20 apart from this NCC Unit of Central University, Jammu had also participated in Azaadi ka Amrut Mahotsav to celebrate the contribution of freedom fighters. Central University of Jammu had incorporated NCC as an "Open Elective Credit Course" under the Choice Based Credit System, in line with NEP 2020 from academic session 2022-2023. NCC unit of CUJ had paticipated and performed exceedingly well in National Camps such as TSC, EBSB and Trekking camps and bagged Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals at All India level. The first batch of NCC cadets passed with 100% results for C Certificate exam in the year 2023. It is pertinent to mention that from the academic year 2023-2024, NCC unit of CUJ had also enrolled first batch of girls cadets running with a strength of 100 (SD/SW) cadets.



Community Radio Station "Tawi Dhara" 91.2MHz

The Central University of Jammu has set up a Community Radio Station, 91.2 MHz "Tawi Dhara" CUJ. 91.2 FM CUJ that will provide a platform to the students, faculty and local people to express themselves and showcase their creativity. Programmes broadcast by the community radio are heard within a radius of 15 to 20 km from the University. 91.2 FM Tawi Dhara CUJ not only addresses the needs of the campus population but also those who are outside the University and are part of the community. 91.2FM Tawi Dhara CUJ will broadcast information related to admissions, examinations, etc. of the Central University of Jammu and placement opportunities for the students. The research, innovations and start-ups in the different departments of the university are conveyed to the local community through this platform. This approach helps to strengthen the need for social/community outreach for a balanced development of the area. Regional music, art, culture and tourism is sought to be preserved and popularized through various programmes. Such programmes add to the entertainment quotient of the CRS. The University students work as radio jockeys, content creators and provide other logistic support.



Radiosonde

Central University of Jammu has launched Radiosonde biweekly from Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science, as a joint venture between the Central University of Jammu and National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with ISRO.

First Radiosonde at Central University of Jammu was launched from Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science on May 29, 2024 by Prof. Sanjeev Jain, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu. This project is coordinated by Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, Prof. Vinay Kumar, Prof. Rakesh Kumar Jha, Dr. Sanjeev Yadav and Dr. Pravesh Pal.

The Radiosonde Network for NICES (RANN) project falls under the NICES (National Information System for Climate and Environment Studies) program, which was formulated by ISRO with a mandate to build an information base for climate change impact assessment and provide recommendation for mitigation. This Radiosonde Ground Station is indigenously developed in the Semi-conductor Laboratory, Mohali (SCL), a make in India product. The data collected from Radiosonde will contribute in the field of atmospheric and Space research.

Radiosonde is a telemetry device for the measurement of vertical profiles of humidity, pressure, temperature, wind speed and direction. The RadioSonde system consists of the balloon borne segment referred as PisharotySonde and the ground segment referred as PisharotySonde Ground Station. PisharotySonde uses sensors for measuring the atmospheric temperature, relative humidity and GPS receiver module for acquiring the wind parameters, altitude, date and time. Sensor and GPS data are processed and transmitted to ground station through antennas. The PisharotySonde System is used for boundary layer studies and upper atmospheric observations.



In Year 2024 we have launched 09 Radiosonde from Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science, Central University of Jammu with the help of B.Tech Students for collecting the Metrological Data. This Radiosonde goes up to the vertical height of 40 Kms and collects and transmit all the atmospheric data to the ground station. All the collected data will be processed for future predictions. In the Year 2025 we will be launching 24 Radiosonde from Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science.

Hostel Facilities

Our university is proud to offer separate hostel facilities for both the girls and the boys, ensuring a comfortable and conducive atmosphere for all. These hostels are equipped with modern amenities, round-the-clock security, and dedicated staff to cater to the unique needs of our diverse student community. Such comfortably-furnished hostels make for a good home away from home. Outstation students are accommodated on the basis of merit and distance. Our girls' hostels are designed to provide safe and supportive space where female students can focus on their academic pursuits and personal growth fostering a sense of empowered community. Similarly, our boys' hostels are designed to offer a comfortable and enriching living experience. Hostels at CUJ are happening premises and are provided with all basic facilities including water coolers with water purifiers, washing machines, common TV room, common reading room and recreation room. Two hostels of 500 and 600 capacity are likely to be completed in the month of July.



Anti-Ragging Measures

The University is committed to prevent ragging and an anti-ragging Committee has been constituted in accordance with the relevant Supreme Court guidelines.

What constitutes Ragging

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof to any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary courses do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students. Any act off in ancial extortion or forceful expenditure/burden put on a fresher or any other student.
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: Sexual abuse, homosexual assaults and stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student

Administrative action in the event of Ragging

- Suspension from attending Classes and Academic privileges.
- Withholding/Withdrawing Scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.

- Debarring from appearing in any Test/Examination or other Evaluation process.




