14TH MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

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To consider the report of the Vice Chancellor, regarding the developments since the last Meeting of the Finance Committee, held on 07th June, 2017.

During the period under report, emphasis has been on strengthening the existing academic programmes. During the current year, the University has 35 programmes across different disciplines.

1.1 Examinations and Results

(i) The Examinations for 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters for Post Graduate Courses pertaining to Academic Session 2016-17 were held in May 2017. The average pass percentage of the said examinations is as under:

(ii) The Examination for 1st, 3rd and 5th Semester for Post-Graduate courses pertaining to Academic Session 2017-18 has been conducted in December 2017, results of which are awaited.

- (a) NKN connectivity of 1 Gbps is available 24 hrs
- (b) Campus is Wi-Fi enabled through Campus Connect.
- (c) LAN connections are also provided
- B. Cyberroam: UTM device CYBERROAM has been installed to provide authorized and secure internet access.
- C. Jio-Dongle: The University has procured 20 Jio Dongles for giving connectivity to some of the Departments and hostels.
- D. Routers, Switches & Wi-Fi Access Points: One router, ten L2 switches and more than 35 Wi-Fi access points have been installed to provide quick and smooth internet access at various locations across the campus.

(Member); Dr. C. Ramakrishna, Professor & Head, D/o Computer Science and Engineering, NITTTR, Chandigarh (Member) and Prof. G. Gopal Reddy, Professor D/o Political Science, Osmania University, Hyderabad, visited both the campuses i.e. main campus Rahya-Suchani (Bagla) and Temporary Academic Block (TAB), Sainik Colony, Jammu.

The University has been accredited and awarded B++ grade (CGPA 2.88).

1.8 Memorandums of Understanding (MOUS):

- (i) An MoU was signed between Central University of Jammu and Haryana Vishvakarma Skill University for skill based academic and research cooperation on 25th August, 2017 in Gurgaon. The MoU was signed by Prof. Ashok Aima, Vice Chancellor, CUJ and Prof. Raj Nehru, Vice Chancellor, Haryana Skill University in presence of Captain Abhimanyu, Finance Minister Haryana. On this occasion, logo of University and vision document was also released.
- (ii) Central University of Jammu signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with NSDL Database Management System On 30th October, 2017. The main objective to sign this MoU was to lodge the academic awards of its students/awardees from the current academic year and also for previous academic years in the NAD portal.

1.9 Special Achievements:

Central University of Jammu received funding support (Rs. 3 Lakh) from National Council of Rural Institutes (NCRI), Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Hyderabad for PhD scholars working on rural community issues such as education, communication and development. The scholar will also get training from NCRI through their regular workshops and programmes. The award is a part of MoU signed with NCRI and CUJ's commitment to engage students and scholars with the rural community. A Committee was constituted to select registered scholar working in the

areas of rural development has been recommended by the committee to NCRI for award of the scholarship.

1.10 <u>Three Months Certificate Course in Yoga</u>

Three months Certificate Course in Yoga at Central University of Jammu was inaugurated by Prof. Ashok Aima, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu On 11th August, 2017. About 40 students belonging to different cross-sections of the society have taken admission in the said course, which has been introduced in the Central University of Jammu for the first time after its approval by the Academic Council, Executive Council and Court of the Central University. The tenure of the course is over and examination for certificate is likely to be held shortly.

To place before the Finance Committee the Annual Accounts along with SAR for the year 2016-17.

The Central University Act-2009 under sub-section 1 of section 31 provides that "the Annual Accounts and Balance Sheet of the University shall be prepared under the directions of Executive Council and shall, once at least every year and at intervals of not more than fifteen months, be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor- General of India or by such persons as he may authorize in this behalf."

Accordingly, the Annual Accounts for the University for the periods 01-04-2016 to 31-03-2017 were compiled in accordance with principles and procedures laid down by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education and as per the guidelines of the UGC. The Accounts have been prepared on accrual basis. The compiled accounts were placed and approved by the Finance Committee in its 13th meeting held on 07th June, 2017 before submission to CAG for auditing.

The CAG party took up auditing of the accounts on 02.06.2017 and completed the job on 30.06.2017. The draft SAR was received on 09.08.2017 and the reply of the same has been furnished on 16.08.2017. The Director General (Audit) Chandigarh on behalf of CAG has issued the SAR for the year 2016-17 vide No. क्रमांक/ No. पी डी ऐ (सी)/केंद्रीय/SAR CUJ 2016-17/4261 dated: 31.10.2017 and the Action Taken Report on the SAR is enclosed as **Annexure-III**).

As per the sub section 2 of the section 31 of the Act, copy of the Annual Accounts together with the Audit Report thereon shall be submitted to the Court and the Visitor along with the observation of the Executive Council. Further, 40 copies of the printed Annual Accounts together with the Audit Report, has been submitted to the MHRD to be laid before both the Houses of the Parliament.

The MHRD vide their letter No. 1-7/2015-U.II (1) dated 2nd November, 2017; 8th November, 2017; and 2nd January, 2018 has approved the pay revision of the Teaching and Non-teaching staff w.e.f. 1st January, 2016 on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC) respectively as following:

- i. Scheme of revision of pay of teachers and equivalent cadres in universities and colleges following the revision of pay scales of Central Government employees on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC); enclosed as Annexure- IV
- ii. Scheme of revision of pay for the posts of Registrar, Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrar, Controller of Examination, Deputy Registrar, Deputy Controller of Examination, Assistant Controller of Examinations, Finance Officer, Deputy Finance Officer and Assistant Finance Officer following the revision of pay scales of Central Government employees on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC); and enclosed as **Annexure-V**
- iii. Pay revision of the non-teaching employees of the Central Universities (CUs) & Centrally funded Deemed Universities, under the administrative control of MHRD regarding enclosed as **Annexure-VI**
- 2. Ministry of Finance vide their letter F. No. 1/1/2016-E-III(A) dated 26th July, 2017 has approved the revision of rates of Allowances extension of Government decisions on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC) in respect of employees of Quasi- Government Organisations, Autonomous Organisations, Statutory Bodies set-up by and funded/controlled by the Central Government placed as Annexure- VII

To consider the Revised Estimates for the year 2017-18 and Budget Estimates for the year 2018-19. (Annexure- VIII)

The Revised Estimates are based on actual flow of funds for expenditure under revenue and capital items. During the current year, the University has established fifteen P.G. programmes, eight regular Integrated M.Phil/Ph.D programmes, four integrated M.Sc. Programmes, ten direct Ph.D programmes, two part-time Ph.D programmes, two Research Centres and two Certificate Courses. The increase in capital and revenue expenditure is attributed to academic and construction activities at site.

The University had an unspent balance of Rs.4854.01 lakhs as on 01st April, 2017 which was taken as the opening balance for the financial year 2017-18.

The demand projected for the year 2017-18 was initially estimated to be Rs. 51000.00 lakhs which has now been revised to Rs.14584.85 lakhs with the revised estimated expenditure of Rs.19248.70 lakhs. Based on this flow of expenditure and expected activities, the University is proposing grant of Rs.18058.00 lakhs during the year 2018-19. Taking into account the proposed grant of Rs.16058.00 lakhs, the University shall be having following funds available for 2018-19.

Out of this, expenditure is estimated to be Rs.18575.20 lakhs as per details given in the **Annexure-VIII**. Therefore, funds to the extent of Rs.18058.00 lakhs are proposed as Grant-in-aid from UGC for the year 2018-19. If funds are available as projected above, the University shall be left with a balance of Rs.603.56 lakhs at the end of the year 2018-19 which may cater to the requirements for one or two months of the subsequent year for administrative expenses and part development including clearing of immediate liabilities.

The Budget Estimates have been prepared keeping in view the construction activities already initiated and planned to be started in coming financial year 2018-19 and other recurring expenses, including salaries.

To report the status of outstanding Audit paras for the year ending 2016-17.

The Audit inspection report on the accounts of the Central University of Jammu for the period 2016-17 was received from the Principle Director of Audit (Central) Chandigarh vide letter No. PDA/CA 2017-18/168-69 dated 27.07.2017. The para wise reply in annotated form was published vide this office letter No. CUJ/Fin/AIR/2017-18/541-43 dated 24.08.2013 (placed as Annexure-IX).

On the basis of reply the para which could not be settled has been received from the Audit office vide letter No. PDA/CA/2017-18/169 dated 08.09.2017 (Placed as **Annexure-X**)

To confirm the action taken by Vice - Chancellor to fix fees of legal counsel for legal opinion/ conference.

Legal counsel vide Letter No. GRA/2016-17, dated 09-06-2017 submitted request for fix fees for legal opinion in important matters like policy matters regarding interpretation of Law, statues of the University as well as other University related matters at the rate of Rs.5000.00 per matter.

In this regard, Central University of Jammu obtained rates of legal opinion from other Universities like Central University of Kashmir which is paying Rs.450/- per opinion and Sher-e Kashmir University of Agriculture Science & Technology (SKUAST) Jammu which is paying Rs.1200/- per legal opinion including miscellaneous and clerkage. The Central University of Jammu also referred to Office Memorandum dated 1st October, 2015 issued by Ministry of Law and Justice; Department of Legal affairs vide No 26(1)/2014/judl which mentions consultation fees at the rate of Rs.450 per conference /consultation.

Accordingly, the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of Executive Council has approved the rates for legal opinion prescribed by office memorandum mentioned above at the rate of Rs. 450/- per conference/ consultant/ opinion (subject to maximum of four conferences/ opinion in a case).

The matter was placed before 13th meeting of Executive Council dated: 11-09-2017 accordingly vide EC-13/ITEM No 11. Executive Council resolved that the matter be placed before next Finance Committee of the University.

At the outset, the Vice Chancellor welcomed all the members and thereafter, the Executive Engineer gave a detailed presentation about the progress of the various works and thereafter, the Agenda items were taken up as under:

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Item No 1:

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To Confirm the Minutes of the 11th Meeting of the Building Committee held on 27th July, 2017.

Resolved to confirm the minutes of the 11th Building Committee meeting.

Item No 2:

To place before the Building Committee the Minutes of the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} Building Advisory Committee meetings for approval.

Resolved to confirm the minutes of the 1st and 2nd Building Advisory Committee meetings.

Item No 3:

To consider report about the development of the Campus since the 11th Meeting of the Building Committee held on 27th July, 2017.

While reviewing the progress of the development works, the committee was appreciative of the works executed so far and recommended that all such contracts where works are either completed or nearing completion, should be wrapped up and the contracts be closed after finalization. The committee also appreciated the optimum utilization of the infrastructure by running Academic classes in Professor's Qrtrs. and also in the Administrative-cum-Academic Block.

However, the committee showed concern on the slippage of the completion dates of ESS-1 & ESS-2 by M/s EPIL as committed during the previous Building Committee meeting. On this, the Executive Director of M/s EPIL, Mr. Thakur apprised the committee that the PMC is exploring various options to get these works executed at the earliest and hand-over the assets to the CUJ.

Item No 4:

To Place before the Building Committee the report about the action taken on the decision of the 11th meeting of the Building Committee held on 27th July, 2017.

Resolved to approve the ATR of the 11th Building Committee meeting.

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Item No 5:

To place before the Building Committee the Report of visit to two Universities by the constituted committee.

Resolved to accept the report and recommendations of the constituted committee.

Item No 6:

To place before the Building Committee the slow progress of Construction of Hostels by CPWD.

There was no representative from the CPWD present in the meeting. The committee noted with concern the slow progress of the both hostel blocks and recommended the CUJ to take up the matter with the higher authorities of CPWD to expedite the progress of works.

Item No 7:

To place before the Building Committee the Extension of Time in favour of the PMC i.e. EPIL in view of the expiry of their contract period.

Resolved that the 3rd EOT be granted by CUJ in favour of M/s EPIL upto 30.04.2018 on provisional basis keeping in view the fact that as the road and electrical works are presently in progress whereas, M/s NCC and M/s Percept Builders have completed the allotted works and their final bills are being prepared. Therefore, it becomes imperative that the contract of M/s EPIL remains alive so as to provide legitimacy to the ongoing works and for processing the RA Bills and final Bills. However, CUJ shall at the time of grant of EOT may decide on levying the liquidate damages/penalty on the PMC.

The committee suggested the Vice Chancellor to take a call on the further works to be assigned to M/s EPIL.

Item No 8:

To place before the Building Committee the final drawing of the Boundary Wall for approval.

The Executive Engineer put up the draft of the modified drawing of Boundary Wall based on the advice of the Building Advisory Committee in its 1st meeting. However, some members showed reservation to the draft design and therefore, to generate further consensus amongst all the members, it was decided that a sub-committee comprising of Sh. V.K Pant, Sh. Kiran Wattal, Sh. Vinod Sharma, Sh. Mohit Mahajan and Sh. Sahil Chopra shall further deliberate on the issue and finalise the drawings

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which shall then be circulated to rest of the committee members for further suggestions approval.

Item No 9:

To place before the Building Committee the list of proposed works to be taken-up as Priority-I & Priority-II by the Central University of Jammu for approval.

- il The Building Committee endorsed the concern of the Advisory Committee in its 2nd meeting with regard to the fact that as on date, there is no designated Academic Block constructed in the campus to run the classes of various courses in a proper manner. Instead, the Academic classes are presently being managed in the Administrative cum Academic Block and in the Professors. Ortrs, after carrying out the necessary modifications, as a stop gap arrangement. Therefore, the committee was of the opinion that the works to be taken-up for execution in future, should be duly prioritized keeping in mind the immediate requirements of the University and thus, agreed to the proposal put-forth by the CUJ under Priority-I and Priority-II, subject to the availability of funds. The committee also requested the Vice Chancellor in one voice to take up the matter of utilisation of funds with the concerned authorities, accordingly.
- ii) The committee also endorsed the decision taken in the 1st Building Advisory Committee meeting held on 25.08.2017 to call-off the tenders of the two science blocks: School of Life Sciences & the School of Basic and Applied Sciences, financial bids of which had been kept on hold by M/s EPIL on the instructions of the CUJ, after considering the comments of the M/s EPIL, as well and advised CUJ to invite fresh tenders for these two works.
- iii) The committee was also on the same page on the concern shown by the Advisory Committee during its 2nd meeting on 03.11.2017 while inspecting the deferred work of 36 Qrtrs, of Associates/Assistant Professors and recommended that the deferred works should be attended to in order to save the structure from deteoration/decay after getting the stability and soundness of the structure inspected by a third party to avoid the expenditure incurred so far, from becoming infructuous.



Item no: 10 Miscellaneous item:

(i) To place before the Building Committee the estimates for Construction of 100 seated Working Women's Hostel in University – under Ministry of Women & Child Development for approval.

The Executive Engineer informed about the policy of the Ministry of Women and Child Development to provide financial assistance to the extent of 75% of the construction cost for the construction of Working Women Hostel to provide safe and affordable accommodation to the Working Women. This apart, one time non-recurring grant of Rs. 7500/- per inmate for purchase of furniture shall also be provided at time of commencement of the hostel. In this context, the CUJ intends to avail the benefits of this scheme and construct one 100 bed hostel in the campus for the working women at an approximate cost of Rs. 8.77 Cr. and submit the proposal to the concerned quarters for sanction. The funds over and above the sanctioned amount shall be met out of the University fund allocation.

Resolved to approve the item.

(ii) It was also decided that the next meeting of the Building Committee shall be held in the 1st week of January' 2018 and the Agenda be circulated well in time.

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Compreller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports CAG's Audit Reports separately.
 - 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements.
