

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

10. Curriculum

The curriculum for Vocational programmes under the aegis of Community College in each year of the programme would be a suitable mix of skill development and general education components. The weight-age for skill development would be 60 % and general education component 40%, The 60:40 credit weightage should be maintained on completion of each level. The curriculum and courseware be aligned as per the Qualification Pack (QP) of the respective Sector Skill Council. The changes if any would be incorporated as per UGC/NSDC guidelines issued from time to time keeping in view the needs of the local industry as well.
